Steve Barber: Candidate for Wing Leader

Steve Barber has been a member of CAF for twenty years. He has served on the CAF General Staff for eleven years, and was Chief of Staff in 2003.

Steve is a Marine, having served in the USMC from 1966 to 1970, with service in Vietnam in 1969-70.

He flies many CAF aircraft, including the F6F Hellcat; F8F Bearcat; SB2C Helldiver; SNJ/AT6 Texan; A6M3 Zero; Spitfire Mk XIV; C-46 Commando; P-51 Mustang and others. He holds an unlimited LOA for single and multi-engine aircraft. He is a CAF fighter check pilot; SNJ check pilot; and a TRARON Formation lead pilot. He founded the Navy's Tailhook Legacy Flight Program along with Admiral Mike Bowman in 1999.

Steve has sponsored several CAF aircraft, and has donated many thousands of dollars to the CAF cause.

He lead the development and fund raising for our hangars, and brought to our Wing the F8F Bearcat, F6F Hellcat, A6M3 Zero, Spitfire Mk XIV, Fairchild F-24, and P-51 Mustang.

He has been the Wing Leader on two other occasions, serving for a total of six years in that office.

Steve is a Senior Vice President of Investments for Stifel Nicolaus & Company, Inc. He has two grown children, Stephen, Jr. (32) and Shellie (40), and a new grandchild, Luke Wilson Barber (7 weeks). His wife, La Tanya, worked for CAF at HQ in Midland for six years.

Steve pledges to continue to recruit new members; to build a new hangar and build a world-class aviation museum as planned. He also wants to improve our Wing's financial standing. In addition to the above, he still wants us all to just have fun.

Dick Troy: Candidate for Wing Leader

Dick has been a member of CAF-SoCAWing since 2002. He has been our Maintenance Officer, and is currently the Executive Officer.

He has an A&P certificate, issued June 14, 1960, and a commercial pilot license with multiengine and instrument endorsements issued June 14, 1968. He has two years of college experience, and served in the Army from 1963 to 1965. While in the Army, he taught airframe repair at Ft. Eustis, Virginia.

Dick joined American Airlines directly out of A&P school in 1960, and made steady progress with AA until he became Manager of Aircraft Maintenance for AA at LAX. He oversaw four shift managers, 350 mechanics, 20 supervisors and all aircraft overnighting or passing through LAX.

Dick's comments on his candidacy:

"I have been involved in the aircraft industry in some form or another since I was a kid in high school. Counting my years in A&P school, I have a combined total of 55 years in aviation, most of it in aircraft maintenance.

I have seen firsthand the consequences of second-rate maintenance, and to me diligence, knowledge, and experience are the safeguards against accidents. We operate a fleet of ageing warbirds, which amplifies the need for strict adherence to all the rules of safety.

I am a firm believer in what our mission at CAF is. I respect my flag, my country, and most of all our veterans – it is for them we do the things we do. I believe that if you are part of this organization, then you need to embrace its concepts. I am encouraged by our young cadets. They need to learn our story. I pledge to do my best to promote the CAF and to help our Wing to grow and prosper."

John has been a member of our Wing for about two years. He has already shown his ability to organize and get things done. He is currently the CAF-SoCAWing's Aviation Museum Director.
