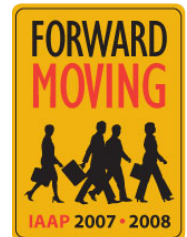

9 EASY STEPS TO A HEALTHIER HEART

9NEWS has 9 Easy Steps to a Healthier Heart. They come from Dr. Michael Roizen, the author of the well known real-age books. He shared them in Reader's Digest:

- 1) Walk 30 minutes a day, every day, no matter what. Walking daily decreases the risk of having a heart attack by about 30 percent.
 - 2) Know your blood pressure and do whatever it takes to get it down to 115/75. The best way to do this, get a little exercise and lose some belly fat.
 - 3) Eat an ounce of nuts a day. Nuts raise HDL, good cholesterol and decrease inflammation.
 - 4) Learn your HDL number and do what you can to raise it to 50, through exercise and healthy fats.
 - 5) Eat 10 tablespoons of tomato sauce a week. It is loaded with blood pressure slashing potassium.
 - 6) Floss your teeth regularly. Avoiding periodontal disease prevents inflammation in the arteries which helps you head off heart disease.
 - 7) Eat no more than 20 grams of saturated fat a day and as little of Trans fat as possible.
 - 8) Read labels and throw out all food that has sugar in the first five ingredients.
 - 9) Eat nine servings of colorful fruits and vegetables a day.
- Experts say you should also consider finding out your heart score.

CRISIS OF TRUST?

I've been researching the quality of Trust lately. And guess what, indicators point to a 'crisis of trust' in not only the US but also round the globe. While I'm not one to join the naysayer's, there is power in awareness and taking pro-active action. My recent findings include:

- 54% of Americans do not trust the media anymore
- Politicians in the presidential race are seen as flip-flopping and untrustworthy in following-through on their promises
- An Australian business study highlighted that over the past 12 months, the number of opinion leaders identifying corporate Australia as 'being trusted to do what is right' decreased 54% from 24% to 11% of respondents

As Steven Covey, Jr. has documented in his best-selling book, *The Speed of Trust*, low trust is the greatest cost in life and in organizations. He describes trust as the aquifer - the huge water pools under the earth that feeds all of the subsurface wells.

In business, these wells are often called innovation, complementary teams, collaboration, empowerment, TQM, brand loyalty, strategic initiatives, etc. It's **trust** that gives sustaining quality to all these business endeavors and relationships - team, supplier and customer relationships.

Trust is the key to all results in life, business and yes, politics. While Covey does a good job of articulating the importance of trust, his focus is more on outer and interpersonal trust and doesn't really deal with Inner Trust and how important I.T. is as a starting point.

It's my philosophy and experience that the essential first step in any trust is - **Inner Trust**. Before you can fully trust others - on your teams, in business or politics, you must learn to trust in yourself first. How can you trust someone else if you have not developed your inner trust?

So in the next series of eLetters I'll be exploring the methodologies and ways to develop and strengthen your Inner Trust. It's essential for success...and the feelings of confidence, balance and self-reliance in business and life.

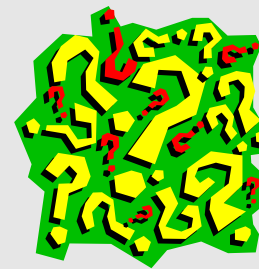

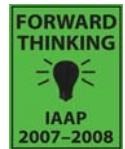
