Jazzy Jackets

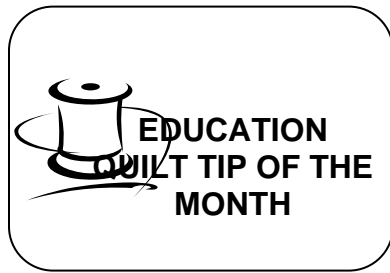

Double Wedding Ring

If you have always wanted that traditional quilt without all the fuss, this is the class for you! Easy, fast, no curved piecing. Mark your calendar for our **April 26th** class. Class fee will be \$10.00 with a \$35.00 kit fee. Registration will begin at our February Guild Meeting.



Border Size – If you are going to add borders to your quilt, the ratio of block to border is paramount. As a general rule, it is unwise to make each side's border more than one-half the size of your block; less than one-half the block size is often visually preferable.

Sew & Tell

Mary Anne Dennis – Mary Anne made 2 baby quilts from scraps left over from other projects. A great way to get your scrap bag under control and make something for a baby.

Ann Crosby – This beautiful teal and white quilt top was pieced by nine ladies in a “Round Robin” fashion.

Barbara Orris – In 1970 Barbara purchased as a counted cross stitch State project (one block for each of the US state). The blocks were impeccably cross stitched by Barbara over the next 20 or so years. Due to eye sight issues Barbara engaged help to cut and square the blocks, ready for piecing. The blocks were then sent to a friend out of state for piecing and quilting. This 25 year project is completed and sure to win many quilt shows.

Mary Stout – Presented were 2 quilts made from material that had been donated to the guild for charity projects. One fabric was brown tones with horses and Mary did a great job of turning it into a wonderful quilt for a child. These quilts will be donated to the American Cancer Society and daniel kids.

Eleanor Armstrong – Eleanor bought this quilt top from Kathy Rutherford. Eleanor added the

borders and chose the back, then put it together. Then she had it quilted. Great job.

Betty Meers - While visiting in Georgia, Betty took a friend to a quilt shop where she fell in love with the fabric and with Betty's encouragement, decided to try her hand at quilting. Betty helped her choose a simple pattern, and her friend chose all the rest of the fabrics. They made a few blocks together and Betty thought she was "on her way."

But her friend became discouraged and insisted on giving Betty the fabric and blocks and said she knew she would never finish it. Betty asked Pat D'Elia if she would be willing to finish it for her so she could give it to her friend as a surprise gift.

Pat had to "correct" some of the blocks, put the top together, add borders, etc. Pat finished it beautifully. Betty is going to surprise her friend with it when she goes up to Georgia in a couple of weeks. What a great story and what a surprise it will be for Betty's friend.

Rosemarie Murphy – This lady has been busy. She had 4 quilts to show today. One was a quilt from retreat, another from her “Round Robin” group another mixed pattern quilt with Sunbonnet Sue and last but not least a beautiful neon colored quilt.

June Rittscher – Took a small bag pattern and made it even smaller to fit her MP3 player. June listens to books as she sews. What a wonderful way to block out the world while sewing. She also completed a child's quilt for a future grand or great grand child.

The pattern was strips used to create a framed effect around the center. The colors for each frame has a special meaning to Leesie and we all ask that she document the colors and why they are special to her. Leesie – your quilt would be a great addition to the quilt registry when we do our day of discovery.

If the recipe is short we may have 2 each month or just 1 a little longer as space permits. The recipe could be one from a Guild event or a family get together or a block party.

Because the food at our Birthday party was so wonderful we have several recipes from that event.

Pulled Pork Recipe

Purchase Boston Butt Roast – Cook the roast in a crock pot. Season only with sea salt and the secret ingredient - “Montreal Steak Seasoning”. Cover the roast with water and **do not** cut any fat from the roast. Cooked on high. It takes about 5 hours for the pork to pull apart or cooked on low overnight.

When done, let the roast cool in another pan, pull the pork away from the fat. Discard the fat. The pork stock is then placed in the refrigerator to let the fat harden. When hardened, discard the fat and use the stock for soup or to season vegetables. Save a little stock to add back to

the pulled pork (but only after the fat has been discarded).

Cooked Pork

1 cup pork stock
¼ cup brown sugar
Enough (your choice) Sonny’s Sweet Bar-B-Q Sauce.

Coke Icing

½ butter
6 tablespoons cola or cherry cola
3 tablespoons cocoa
1 box sifted powdered sugar

Boil the first 3 ingredients in a sauce pan. Pour over powdered sugar and beat until smooth. Pour over hot cake while it is still in the pan. The secret here is to pour icing over hot cake.

For the cake, use a yellow butter cake mix. Where the recipe calls for water I use milk. Where the recipe calls for oil I use butter. Bake the cake in a 10 X 13 pan.

Savory Stuffed Squash

- * 4 large, 6 medium, or 8 small yellow squash
- * ¼ c. butter or margarine
- * ½ c. chopped onion
- * 1 c. finely diced cooked ham
- * 2 tbs. grated Parmesan cheese
- * 2 tbs. snipped parsley
- * ½ tsp. seasoned salt
- * 26 Ritz crackers, coarsely crushed (about 1-½ cups)

Cut squash in half lengthwise and scoop out centers. (A grapefruit spoon works really well for this.) Chop scooped out part and set aside. Cook scooped out halves in lightly salted water in a large covered pot about 10 minutes or until almost tender. Drain.

In skillet melt butter or margarine; add onion and ham; sauté until onion is golden. Stir in

chopped squash and cook until tender. Stir in remaining ingredients. Spoon into squash halves.

Place stuffed squash in large shallow baking pan. Pour 1/2 cup water over bottom of pan. Bake uncovered in preheated oven at 400 degrees for 15 minutes or until heated through. Sprinkle with parsley, if desired.

A native of Altoona, PA, Charlie and her husband have lived in Florida for five years. She enjoys spending much of her time caring for her grandson.

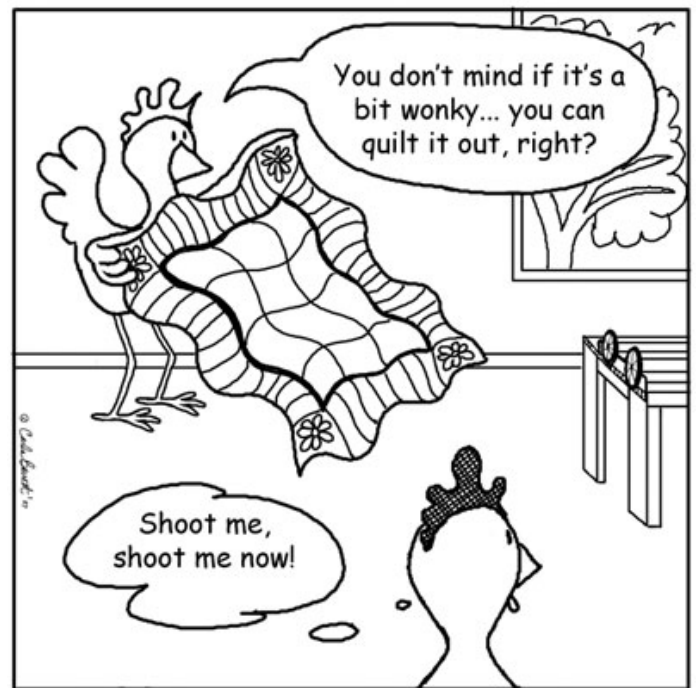
