## Upcoming Events

### Ellen Lindner Class

Ellen Lindner will be teaching Adventures in Color workshop Jan. 26, 2009. This is a class for the novice and experienced quilter alike, and will appeal to both the traditional and art quilter-- in other words, everyone! We will be using paper only, not fabric, and Ellen promises that her series of exercises will make us experts in color by the end of the day.

The fee for this 6 hour class is \$30 with a \$4 supply fee. You will need to bring \$4 for the supply fee and \$3 for a delicious lunch catered by Harriett the day of the class. ### Bleached Discharge

Our own Julie Mainor will be teaching a bleach discharge class February 9th. If you were at Demo Day, you saw how Julie incorporated art quilt techniques into traditional quilting with her Zingy Zingers. So put some zing in your quilting with this new technique! The charge for this 3 hour class is just \$10.00.

Julie Mainor has been teaching since 2001 and specializes in discovering the creativity in self-professed non-creative quilters and turning "I've never sewn before" into "Oh my Goodness, look what I made!" FUN is of the highest priority in

her workshops and classes. Julie's award winning quilts have been displayed at colleges, museums and businesses throughout North Florida and South Georgia. She gracefully walks the line between the quilt world and the art world fusing the two in her own unique style, all the time sharing with others her refreshingly easy techniques.

Students in this workshop will choose between making a quilt featuring 3-D leaves with shadows or a quilt with a beaded bird at sunset. Warning - We do get messy! Be sure to wear your paint clothes and bring your sense of adventure. Learn several methods of bleach discharge in one workshop. Create a wall hanging where beautiful leaves appear to float right off the quilt or create a stunning sunset scene with amazing ease. Kits available for \$13.00

## Leaves and Shadows

### Materials Needed

- \*  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard black cotton (test the selvage with bleach pen to see what color it will turn.
- \*  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard batik for leaves and border
- \*  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard backing, can be the same batik
- \*  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard accent color for tiny border
- \* Strips for binding
- \* Steam a seam – any variety - one or two 8X11 sheets

### Other Supplies Needed

- \*  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard piece – batting, thin cotton
- \* Threads – black, orange, golden yellow, (variegated is good)
- \* Freezer paper
- \* Gloves
- \* Small spray bottle

- \* Fine top sharpie or pencil
- \* Apron or big T-shirt
- \* Sewing machine
- \* Pins. Snips
- \* Seam ripper, etc.
- \* Paper scissors

## Bird at Sunset

### Materials Needed

- \*  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard – black cotton -- test the selvage with bleach pen to see what color it will turn.
- \*  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard border fabric
- \*  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard backing – can be the same color as the discharge (orange print)
- \*  $\frac{1}{4}$  accent color for tiny border

### Other Supplies Needed

- \* Black and orange thread
- \*  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard piece – batting, thin cotton
- \* Freezer paper
- \* Gloves
- \* Small spray bottle
- \* Fine tip sharpie or pencil
- \* Apron or big T-shirt
- \* Sewing machine
- \* Pins, snips
- \* Paper scissors
- \* Seam ripper, Etc.

## Fabric Art Journal

### Vicki Zoller

Do you like to scrapbook? Are you looking a project that would use up some of your scraps that are too small for a quilt but too cool to throw away? Do you like to make fabric postcards? Are you looking for something to inspire you with new ideas? Have I got a project for you!

This January we will start a year long project, a fabric art journal. This project is an adaptation of the Journal Quilt Project, organized in 2003 by Karey Bresenhan, Director of the International Quilt Festival at Houston. You can see some of these journals at [www.quiltart.com/journals](http://www.quiltart.com/journals).

The journals have also been a popular project for local guilds, also. They are a great way to tap into your creativity, use some of your great stuff you have hanging around your sewing room, make a finished project that won't take up a lot of room, and just have a lot of fun. If you

were at Demo Day, you saw examples of the journal pages. Basically they are 8"x10" fabric postcards, using all sorts of materials with a different theme or technique specified for each month. At the end of the year, we will put all 12 pages into a "book" that will bind them together.

This project gives you the freedom to use unconventional materials and fabrics. There is no need for all fabrics to be 100% cotton-- you won't be washing the pages. You can also use all those great yarns, stamps, and other cool materials that you may have admired, but didn't know how to use.

The basic directions for a journal page were in the November newsletter and they are repeated here. Keep them for reference as you make your pages.

Here is the theme for January's page: Stitches! Play with all those stitches on your sewing machine. If you only have a few stitches on your machine, alter the length and width of the stitches for variety. You may also want to go a little crazy with wild colored threads. If you haven't used variegated thread, now is the time to try it.

Here is the theme for February's page: One Color! Use only one color on your page. You may use different shades and hues of the color and different materials (such as yarn, ribbon, tulle, or inks), but only one color.

We will be showing the January page at the February general meeting. If you are an overachiever and finish your February page early, bring it, too! You have plenty of time to get your materials and come up

with a neat page. It is so much fun to see how we all interpret the theme differently. Here is a hint for the theme of the March page: Postage, Incorporated.

## **Fabric Art Journal**

Materials:

- ☆ Pellon Wonder Under 805
- ☆ Pellon Peltex 70 (do NOT use anything stiffer than Peltex 70) (I have found both of these products at Wal-Mart and Jo-Ann Fabrics.)
- ☆ Fabrics
- ☆ Basic sewing supplies

Instructions: Cut a piece of Peltex 70 to 8" X 10". Fuse a piece of fabric the same size to the Peltex as a background. Fuse and sew other fabric and embellishments to this as desired. Monofilament thread used through the needle is great if you don't want your stitches to be a part of the design. Fuse a piece of fabric to the back. You may journal on the back, using a permanent pen (Pigma pen) or appliqué the back before fusing it. Think of the back as another opportunity for design. You may want to include the month, describe methods used of the front side of you page, write about what you did that month, include a quotation, or anything else you can think of.

Finish edges as desired. If you are doing a machine blanket stitch or zigzag on the edge, you might want to round the corners slightly to make your sewing easier. Each page is essentially a large scale fabric postcard.

**Remember:** You will be punching holes to link together your pages later. Leave about an inch on the left edge of the front of the page free of decoration. The inch on the left page will be where your pages will eventually link together. To make the holes there is a really nifty contraption called a Crop-a-dile. It can be found in the scrapbook section of Michael's, Jo-Ann Fabrics, and Hobby Lobby. It punches holes, sets eyelets, and lots more. If you want to get a head start on the eyelets for the holes, purchase the 3/16" size. They come in lots of fun colors. You do not have to purchase a Crop-a-dile. I will set the eyelets for you periodically. Have fun with this project!

## **Demo Day Presentation**

**Vicki Zoller**

### **Appliqué for the Needle-turn Impaired**

Materials: Tulle  
Monofilament thread  
Freezer paper  
Fabric

1. Cut appliqué pattern (no seam allowance) from freezer paper.
  2. Rough cut fabric and tulle.
  3. Place appliqué pattern over fabric (right side up) and tulle. Press with low heat with a dry iron.
  4. Stitch at the edge of appliqué pattern with a very small stitch, using monofilament thread through the needle and a neutral thread in the bobbin.
  5. Cut a slit in the back and turn, being careful not to poke through the corners.
  6. Press with steam.
  7. Machine or hand appliqué as desired.

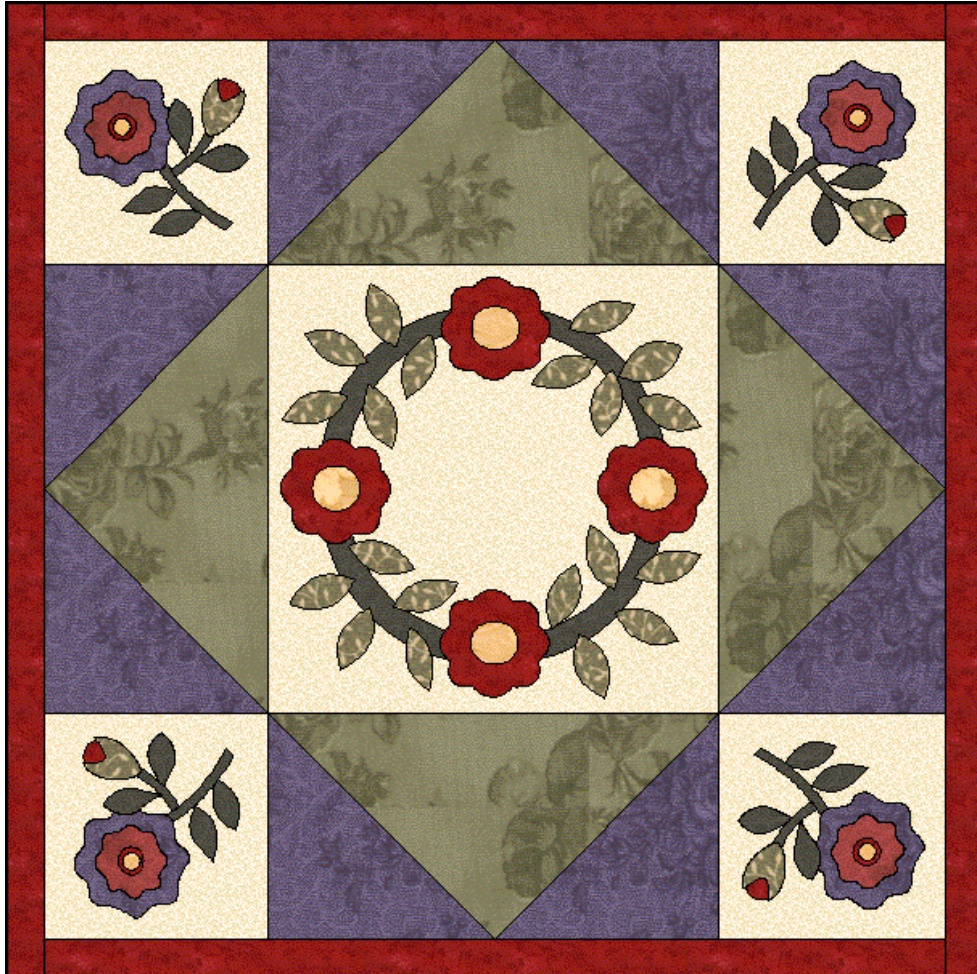
