### July's Featured Quilter:

#### Sally Eunpu

Sally Loorents Eunpu was born in Bronx, New York, in 1930. She has lived in Lakewood, New Jersey; Troy, New York; Chicago; Tampa; Lewes, Delaware and Fairfax County, Virginia. Sally has lived in Florida for five years.

A quilter for about six years, Sally learned to quilt by reading anything she could find on quilting, cutting fabric, sewing patterns and taking a few classes. Sally says she particularly enjoys the process of just learning and doing on her own.

Sally has been a member of All Stars for three years. She has served as Vice President (in charge of Programs), worked with the Florida Quilt Index group and volunteered at QuiltFest. The thing she enjoys most about the Guild is the people – their kindness, work excellence, honesty and willingness to share their expertise in all areas of quilting. She says that she is “in awe of their capacity to give and do whatever needs to be done. I am honored to be a part of this Guild.”

Currently, Sally is working with the Guild's Fearless Design Group. According to Sally, the group's goal is to work outside the box, to develop their own ideas and understand how to create new quilting concepts. The group meets monthly and started out by using concepts found in the book, Fearless Design for Every

Quilter by Lorraine Torrence and Jean B. Mills (C&T Publishing, 2009). The mission of the group has evolved over the past few months. Instead of sitting through lectures by one person, the group is participatory. Members take turns teaching concepts (a perfect example of how Guild members learn from one another). The group looks at the basic needs of quilt design – balance, how color changes affect the design, symmetry and asymmetry in design and other concepts that can help improve your quilt design.

In addition to quilting, Sally enjoys reading, knitting, writing, bird-watching and gardening. She is adjusting to living a different life since her husband Floyd passed away.

Sally married Floyd Eunpu in 1951 (according to Sally, the name Eunpu is Estonian and means “applewood”). Floyd and Sally lived in on-campus housing at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York, while Floyd was pursuing his degree in Civil Engineering specializing in institutional water systems. Floyd received his B.S. degree in 1953, and as part of the experience of being married to a veteran, Sally also received her own special degree called PHTS (Pushing Hubby Through School). Their first child, Deborah Lee, was born in Troy while Floyd was attending school. They also have three sons, Steven, David and Andrew. After moving many times for job transfers, they settled in Fairfax County, Virginia, where they lived from 1960 to 1995.

Sally says that their greatest dream was answered when their youngest son graduated from college and they realized they had earned seven college degrees as a family. As Sally says, "learning makes everything possible". Sally has nine grandchildren, two boys and seven girls. Four grandchildren live in northern Virginia, four in Lesterville, Missouri, and one grandchild lives in Jacksonville.

According to Sally, she is a "late bloomer". She completed her undergraduate degree in Education and English and her graduate degree in Reading after her third child, David Paul, was born. She taught first and fourth grades for a while and then became a Reading Specialist. Sally says that her mantra through life has been learning. She says that when she was about 19 years old, a "fine, elderly dentist" gave her a wonderful goal: "to learn something new each year". He told Sally, "Think of how many new things you will know in 20 years". Sally says that the gentleman will be her mentor for the rest of her life.

### Quilting Tip - Bindings

When trimming your quilt sandwich, leave about 1/8" extra past the binding attachment. That is, an extra 1/8" batting all the way around the quilt. Then, when you fold the binding to the back to stitch it down, the bulk of that extra 1/8" will fill in the binding so it doesn't seem to hang loosey-goosey or flat.

Personally – I like my binding to be full and not flat. This tip helps me achieve a "full binding". Try it – I think you will like the new look of your binding.

He stayed and watched as my machine buzzed away.

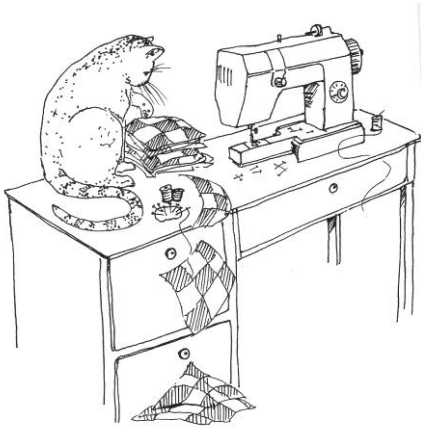
Then an occasional yawn, his intent did betray.

## Recipe of the Month

### July Pie

I call this my 4<sup>th</sup> of July pie because it has the red, white and blue colors, plus the berries are in season now. It has always come out perfect for me. Enjoy.

#### Gingersnap Berry Pie

From Better Homes and Gardens 1986

Crushed gingersnaps, crushed vanilla wafers, and chopped walnuts make the delicious no-fuss crust for this pie.

- 1 cup finely crushed gingersnaps (15 cookies)
- ¾ cup finely crushed vanilla wafers (18 cookies)
- ¼ cup finely chopped walnuts
- 1/3 cup butter or margarine, melted
- 1 envelope unflavored gelatin
- 1 ¾ cups unsweetened white grape juice
- 1 8 oz. package cream cheese, softened
- ¼ cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 ½ cups blueberries
- 1 ½ cups sliced strawberries
- Citrus leaves

For crust, in a medium mixing bowl combine crushed gingersnaps, crushed vanilla wafers, and walnuts. Add butter or margarine; toss well. Press crumb mixture onto bottom and 1 ½ inches up the sides of a 9-inch spring-form pan to form a firm, even crust. Bake in 375\* oven for 5 minutes. Cool on a wire rack before filling.

Meanwhile, in a medium saucepan soften gelatin in the grape juice for 5 minutes. Stir over low heat till gelatin dissolves. Chill 40 to 50 minutes or till partially set (consistency of unbeaten egg whites), stirring occasionally (*don't forget about it and chill it too long*).

While the gelatin mixture sets - in a small mixer bowl beat the cream cheese, sugar, and vanilla with an electric mixer on medium speed till smooth (*this is the white*). Spread mixture over bottom of prepared crust. Spoon **half** of the gelatin mixture over cream cheese layer. Top with **1 ½ cups** of the blueberries, all of the sliced strawberries, and then the remaining blueberries. Spoon the remaining gelatin mixture, over berries (*red and blue in a clear gelatin*). Chill for 4 to 6 hours or till set. To serve, loosen crust with a narrow spatula; remove the sides of the spring-form pan. Garnish with citrus leaves.

Makes 12 to 16 servings.
