Cook & Share

Goopy Butter Cake (Paula Deen's)

Serves – 15 to 20

- * 1 – 18 ¼ oz package yellow cake mix
- * 1 – egg

- * 8 tablespoons (1 stick) butter, melted
- Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
Combine ingredients and mix well.
Pat in to a lightly greased 13 X 9 inch baking pan.

Filling

- * 1 – 8 oz. package cream cheese, softened
- * 2 eggs
- * 1 teaspoon vanilla
- * 8 tablespoons (1 stick) butter, melted
- * 1 – 16 oz box powdered sugar

Beat cream cheese until smooth.
Add eggs, vanilla, and butter - beat.
Add sugar and mix well.
Spread over cake mixture.

Bake 40 – 50 minutes

Do not over bake.

Center should be a little gooey.

Variations –

- * Add 20 oz. can crushed pineapple (drained) to filling (this is what I use)
- * Add 15 oz. can pumpkin to filling – add cinnamon and nutmeg
- * Use lemon juice and zest
- * Use chocolate cake mix and add chocolate chips and nuts to top of filling
- * Use spiced carrot cake mix and add chopped nuts and shredded carrots to filling
- * Use mandarin oranges, bananas, blueberries or strawberries
- * Use chocolate cake mix and add ¾ to 1 cup peanut butter and nuts to filling

Product Review

After reading Carole's article about Color Catchers, I have another use for them.

After you use your Color Catcher in the laundry, they will probably turn a really neat color. Mine are often lavender or green. Back them with some lightweight fusible web. Cut them into

simple shapes, such as circles. Then doodle on them with a permanent pen. If you are not a natural doodler, Google "zentangles" and go to the YouTube videos for some fun inspiration.

Fuse your creations to fabric postcards. You can sew the Color Catchers down very easily with monofilament thread, using a small zigzag stitch. And Voila! You have a unique fabric postcard.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Sunnie Malesky. Thanks for the great group presentation last month, especially to Melinda Rials and Julie Mainor.

Minutes of the last meeting were accepted as published.

Lani Gardner gave the treasurer's report. Vicki Zoller introduced our **Featured Quilter** for May, Margaret Stewart. Kathy Rutherford was featured in the April newsletter, but Vicki was away, so both received their special name badges.

Committee Reports: Communication – Betty Ann Agnew acknowledged Margaret Stewart and Shirley Simmons for finding errors in the newsletter. She also reminded us that newsletter articles are due by the end of the day on June 7th.

Community Service – Rosemarie Murphy announced there will be a food drive at the June meeting for the Food Bank. She asked that we

keep quilts and placemats coming, and she has star blocks for two charity quilts if anyone would be willing to put them together. Wounded Warrior quilts should be approx. 50X60 and are needed by July 15th for this retreat. Safe Harbor quilts are needed by Thanksgiving. Sunnie reminded us that both free fabric and batting are still available, and also that pillowcases to go with the quilts are appreciated.

Membership – 54 members braved the rain today. Trish Egbert and Andrea Pellegrino won the drawing.

There are no templates used in Maple Island Quilt patterns, instead you will find clever cutting and often unexpected block rotations to make these quilts work. The bold looks and clean design lines allow you to put your own look into the quilt through fabric selection, block rotations and placement. Debbie Bowles writes and publishes these innovative single quilt patterns for her company, Maple Island Quilts. Check out the web-site for this pattern and other designs at www.mapleislandquilts.com. **Lynn Provencher from Country Crossroads Quilt Shop** will be teaching the class. This is scheduled for a 6 hour class. Bring a sack lunch. Class fee will be \$10.00 and \$8.25 pattern fee.



July 26th - "Mad Money" Quilt - Nancy Wines

This is the class for you if you like a fast easy pieced quilt. 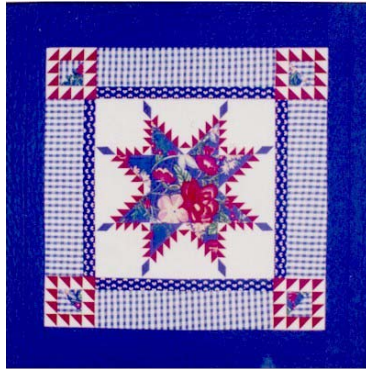


August 23rd - "Feathered Star" Wall hanging - Nancy Mahony

All-Star Quilters' Guild....Where everyone can shine!

This month's featured quilter - Trish Egbert

Trish Egbert has been quilting since 1993, but found her way to All Stars just one year ago. When asked what she enjoys about being a member of the Guild, she responded, "What's not to enjoy?" She likes the choice of activities, the laughter, delights of sew and tell, great classes, interesting programs, super food, and the camaraderie. She also really likes the element of service associated with All Stars.

Trish finished both a Wounded Warriors and a Safe Harbor quilt last summer. She forced herself to machine something larger than a baby quilt and succeeded. These projects built her confidence as a machine quilter, and she went on to make two quilts for Christmas presents. She completed them the same year she started them, a goal many of us aspire to, but don't often achieve!

Trish also enjoys being involved with QuiltFest. She has entered a quilt in the show for the last three years and she found the take-in and judging fascinating. Currently she is working with the QuiltFest 2011 Theme and Challenge Committee.

Quilt Discovery Day is another of Trish's interests. As part of the committee for this group, she filled out the SSQA grant application for All Stars. She is involved in this project because she believes it is important work to document the efforts of quilters of the past, primarily women, whose talents and artistry have historically been over looked and undervalued.

All Stars is Trish's first Guild, but like many members she is part of a small group, also. She meets with three other women in her neighborhood almost every Tuesday afternoon.

She and fellow All Star Bobbi Miller made about a dozen Meals on Wheels placemats last year, and they are currently working a daniel quilt.

Trish loves machine piecing - the more pieces and different fabrics the better. Her current

project is the Penny Sempert pattern "Square Dancing Stars" that requires over 2,300 triangles from 2 ½ inch squares of 30's repro fabrics, plus white centers squares and sashing strips. She has always been a hand quilter and still loves it, but now she machine quilts if it suits the quilt. It is so much faster.

Trish is a Jacksonville native. She lived on San Jose Blvd. and Neptune Beach growing up and graduated from Fletcher HS and UF. She did spend eight years living in Baton Rouge, LA, where she received her degree in library science from LSU. She had her first professional library job in Hammond, LA, at Southeastern Louisiana University (now LSU-Hammond).

Trish is retired from the Jacksonville Public Library, where her husband Steve still works, purchasing DVDs, books on tape, and fiction for the library system. Trish's daughter Jeannie graduated from Guilford College in Greensboro, NC, last year with a degree in theater. After working for Disney for six months in Orlando, she has moved to NYC to try to break in to acting. Trish's sister is the Registrar for Florida State College.

In addition to quilting, Trish enjoys cooking, reading (especially science fiction), and is a member of her church's bell choir. She is also an avid sports fan and has season tickets to the Jaguars. Her year has three seasons: football season, basketball season, and quilting season. Quilting is approximately April through August, when there are no games on TV to lure her out of her sewing room!
