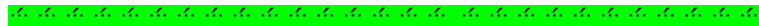

Hello Yoginis!

Thank you to all who participated in the Yoga for Health and Harmony workshops. We all come to yoga for different reasons and from various stages in our bodies' yet we can all share the yoga of breath and new understanding about what yoga really is all about. I hope each of you took away at least one thing yogic that you can incorporate into your own health and harmony.

For those of you who may be interested in pursuing a regular yoga class I will be available in June, but gone in July and August. We can arrange a small class at someone's home or rotate among homes. Each class would cost \$30 and be divided among those who attend. Thus, the more who come, the less the class would cost per person. A vote was taken on the Revision of Class Policies and the majority ruled in favor of adopting the following policies beginning January 2009:

1. Registration for classes will be announced to guild members and non-guild members at a date scheduled by the Education Chairman. Payment for classes must accompany registration. Fees are non-refundable unless space can be filled from a waiting list.
2. A minimum of eight pre-paid students is required for a class. Cancellation will be one month prior to class date unless otherwise specified by teacher. If a class is cancelled by the Guild, fees will be refunded.
3. A Guild member who teaches an approved and scheduled class for the Guild shall be paid \$75.00 for a three-hour class and \$125.00 for a six-hour class. Payment will be by check drawn on the Guild treasury.

4. Guild members taking a class taught by a Guild member shall pay \$10.00. The Education Chairman will determine fees for other classes. Cost for non-guild members will be determined by Education Chairman.
5. Teachers may supply a kit of needed items and charge an additional small fee. Kit charges must be announced prior to registration.
6. **DO NOT GIVE FEES TO THE GUILD TREASURER.** Fees must be recorded by the Education Chairman to insure your place in the class. It is the responsibility of the Education Chairman to remit fees to the Treasurer. You may also mail your fee to the Education Chairman.
7. A Guild member housing an out-of-town teacher will be eligible to take the class taught by that teacher at no cost.
8. A supply list for classes will be provided to students prior to the date of the class.
9. All teachers will be provided with a contract to sign.
