That's the fabric available for our charity quilts. For the children there is a lot of fabric, and we have 2 pre-printed panels along with backing...just layer and quilt!

For the Wounded Warriors or Safe Harbor we have several sets of 6 printed pillow blocks: some are African animals, and some are tigers. One set of Native Americans, horses, and buffalo. These can be cut up to make a larger quilt or used as-is. There are also 2 sets of 4 blocks that would make a good start for a quilt. There is still plenty of backing fabric, especially for kids' quilts, and other pieces you can add to your own fabric.

Come & get it at the March 15<sup>th</sup> meeting! Batting will also be available for charity quilts...bring in your finished top and we'll cut batting to fit after the meeting.

### EDUCATION QUILT TIP OF THE MONTH

**Reducing/Enlarging Your Block Size – To reduce a pattern by using your photocopier, divide the size you want it to be by the size you have. For example, if you want to reduce an 18” block to a 15” block, divide 15 by 18 and then multiply by 100 to get 83%. This is the setting you should use on your copier. To enlarge, divide the size you have by the size you want it to be and multiply by 100.**

This month, Betty Meers is sharing her recipe -  
**Marinated Vegetable Salad**

1 (16 oz.) can green peas  
 1 (12 oz.) can white shoe peg corn  
 1 (16 oz.) French green beans  
 3/4 cup chopped celery  
 1 sm. green pepper (optional)  
 1 medium onion, chopped  
 pimento to taste

Drain vegetables, Combine with onion, celery, and pimento. Pour dressing over this and put in refrigerator.

### **Sweet Sour Dressing**

1/2 cup salad oil  
 1/2 cup distilled vinegar  
 3/4 cup sugar  
 1 tsp salt  
 1/2 tsp. pepper

Combine. Heat to boiling. Cool and pour over vegetables. Better several days old.

### **Key Lime Cheesecake Bars**

2 1/2 cups of stick pretzels, finely crushed  
 3 eggs  
 2T. sugar  
 1 1/2 tsp finely shredded lime peel  
 1/2 cup butter, melted.  
 3 T. key lime juice or regular lime juice  
 Two 8 oz. cream cheese, softened.  
 1/4 c chopped salted pistachios  
 2/3 cups sugar  
 Lime slices (optional)  
 1 tsp vanilla

Heat oven to 350. Grease the bottom of a 2 - quart rectangular baking dish; set aside.

**Make Crust:** In a bowl stir together crushed pretzels, 2 T sugar, and melted butter. Press mixture evenly into bottom of prepared baking dish. Bake 10 minutes; Cool on wire rack.

**Filling:** In large mixing bowl beat cream cheese, 2/3 c sugar and vanilla on medium to high. Add eggs all at once. Beat on low-speed just until combined. Stir in lime peel and juice. Pour mixture over crust. Sprinkle with nuts.

Bake in 350 degree oven 20 to 25 minutes or until center appears set. Cool in dish on wire

rack 30 minutes. Cover: Chill 4 to 24 hours. If desired, garnish with lime slices.

Yields: 15 to 20 bars.

This wonderful recipe came from Gay Montgomery. Thanks Gay for sharing with us.

The pattern I used for the batik queen quilt is an Atkinson Design – “Winners Bouquet”. The pattern comes with 3 templates and the pieces are cut on the bias. The curves are very easy – no pinning needed.

### **What we all need to know....**

Advice from a Singer Sewing Manual from 1949: Prepare yourself mentally for sewing. Think about what you are going to do. . . never approach sewing with a sigh or lackadaisically. Good results are difficult when indifference predominates. Never try to sew with a sink full of dirty dishes or beds unmade. When there are urgent housekeeping chores, do these first so your mind is free to enjoy your sewing. . .When you sew, make yourself as attractive as possible. Put on a clean dress.
