March's Featured Quilter: Elfrieda Echt

This month's featured quilter, Elfrieda Echt, has been an active member of All Stars since 1993. In that time she has served as President, Hospitality Chairman, Membership Chairman and Quilt Mother. She has been a member of the 501C3 committee, the Challenge Coordinator and she has served as Treasurer three times! She also demonstrated the technique for English paper piecing at a Guild Demo Day. As a Guild member, Elfrieda especially enjoys meeting other quilters, the fellowship with members and the programs and activities like Sew & Tell. She has entered quilts in QuiltFest and one year won a Third Place ribbon with her quilt.

Elfrieda has been quilting for 20 years. She became interested in quilting when she visited an art center in North Carolina where she saw beautiful quilts on display. The quilts were too expensive to buy, but her husband encouraged her to try making her own quilt. Elfrieda took her first quilting class at FCCJ, and later she took a class at a local quilt show. The class was taught by Sunnie who invited Elfrieda to join All Stars. Elfrieda prefers to make pieced quilts, and she says she has always wanted to try making a Mariner's Compass.

Elfrieda also likes to read novels, knit, crochet and ride on the back of her husband Bernie's BMW motorcycle. Aside from a short trip to North Carolina, they haven't taken a

road trip recently, but one summer Elfrieda flew to Denver and met her husband who had ridden there on his motorcycle. They took a motorcycle trip through Colorado, Utah and Wyoming which Elfrieda says was a wonderful experience.

Although she has lived in Florida for 33 years, Elfrieda is originally from Bavaria in Germany. She lived for a few years in a tiny village (only three houses) called Haunprechting. She moved to other larger towns twice, and she came to the United States with her husband when she was 19. Elfrieda comes from a large family – she has five brothers and two sisters, and they all have children. They are all still living in Germany, and she goes back for visits every four or five years. Elfrieda and her husband have two sons, Bernie and Phillip, and five grandchildren (two boys and three girls). A sixth grandchild is due in September.

When she was 17, Elfrieda thought she wanted to become a nurse, but after one year of nursing school, she decided that the nursing profession was not for her. Since then, she has worked for a dry cleaning business, co-owned a dry cleaning store and worked as a secretary. She now does the bookkeeping for her husband's business, which services dry cleaning machinery.

According to Elfrieda, most people don't know that she used to be painfully shy.

Mystery Quilt - Quilt of Valor

I am looking forward to seeing a group of ladies on April 25th. Should be a great day. I have started to follow the directions and have cut out and sewed together Clue 2 and Clue 3. This will help you when you are really to start and I have some hints that may be helpful. Also to make things go a little faster, you should have your fabrics cut and ready to go (if you want to wait until the 25th that is OK as

well). One more step would be to draw a line (use a pencil or non-permanent marking pen) diagonally on the REVERSE side of the Clue E. You should have cut 96 - 2 ½ inch squares. Just draw the diagonal line on 64 of them and put the other 32 aside for now. So far we have 11 people signed up. Would love to have 20 for this worthwhile charity. We do have some batting and some larger pieces of material that can be used for backing when we are ready for that step.

Cook & Share

Savory Chuck Roast

- ♥ 1 (3 pound) boneless chuck roast, trimmed
- ♥ 2 TBS. white vinegar
- ♥ ¼ cup all-purpose flour
- ♥ 1 pkg. dry onion and mushroom soup mix
- ♥ ¾ cup sweet sherry
- ♥ 1 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
- ♥ 1tsp. garlic salt
- ♥ 2 TBS. olive oil
- ♥ ¼ cup brewed coffee

Rub roast with vinegar. Cut 8 to 10 slits in roast; sprinkle garlic salt into slits. Dredge roast in flour. Brown roast on all sides in hot oil. If baking, put in Dutch oven. If cooking in

slow cooker, put it in cooker. Stir together soup mix, sherry, and coffee and pour over roast. Add sliced mushrooms.

Bake in oven: cover and bake for 3 hours at 350°. Slow cooker: cook on high for 2 hours then reduce temperature to low and cook for 7 hours.

Quilt Discovery Day

Quilt Discovery Day: Saturday

March 19th

Come and see the wonderful quilts! Show up to help, even if you have not signed up.... you don't need any special training, but you will learn a lot! Quilt appraiser Nan Moore will be joining us as our expert.

We'll set up on Saturday morning starting at 8:30 (you are welcome any time!) and open for the public at 10, or as soon as we are ready. The last quilts will be accepted at 2:00 so that we can be finished by 3:30. As with a quilt show judging, please do not wear makeup if you will be handling quilts (Description and Photography stations). You may bring a lunch to keep in the kitchen, as no food or drink will be allowed in the room with the quilts. All Star members may bring their quilts for photography, which will be done as time allows. This day is primarily for the public. If you are documenting your own quilts and need help with the form, please ask. We will have one last for-members session of photos and assistance sometime in April. Quilts recorded by May 1st will be among the first entries for the Quilt Index (<http://www.quiltindex.org>) to be viewable online by the end of this year. Any documentation done after that will be entered at a later date.

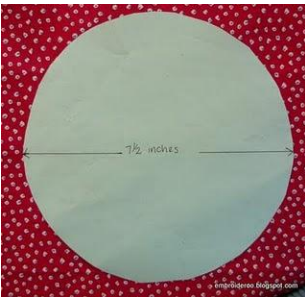

Strawberry Pincushion Tutorial from www.embroideroo.com



You will need:

- 8 inch square of red fabric
- scrap of green felt
- strong thread, sewing needle, scissors
- stuffing
- hot glue gun



Let's get started!

Draw a 7 1/2 inch circle on a piece of paper. Mark the diameter. Cut out the paper circle. Pin to your fabric, and cut out the circle of fabric.



Cut fabric circle in half. This will make two pincushions. (one for you, one for a friend).



Take one of these pieces and fold in half. Right sides together. Pin. Draw a line in pencil along the straight edge, curving it just before the

fold (see photo) - because you don't want to have a 'pointy' strawberry :)
Stitch along the line.



Next, turn the fabric right side out, it will look like a cone.



With doubled strong thread, sew a gathering stitch about a quarter of an inch from the top. Stuff the strawberry firmly. Pull in gathering thread and tie in a knot, but don't cut yet. The strawberry leaves will cover the top of the strawberry, hiding the gathering and the small area of stuffing in the center.

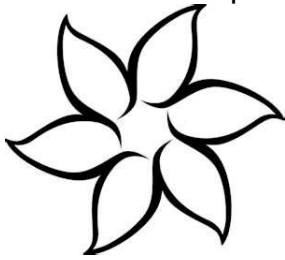


Cut out the strawberry top pattern from green felt. Thread them onto the top of the strawberry, leave a tiny loop and tie off with a strong knot.

Hot glue the leaves onto the strawberry top, put a small dot of glue under each leaf to hold it down.



This picture shows a stem, we'll be attaching a ribbon to the loop instead.
