Coming Up..

In *September* we will not have a class due to QuiltFest.

In *October* (16th) we have an exciting class. Emmie Seaman, an award winning quilter from Missouri, will teach *Improvisational Quilt Design*. If you would like to make an "art quilt" but think the design process is too difficult, this class is for you. Come and unleash you inner art quilter! This 6 hour class will be Thursday, October 16. The cost is \$30. Emmie used to live in Jacksonville, so some of you may be familiar with her work. Check out her website at www.emmieseaman.com and prepare to be inspired.

Improvisational Piecing: October 16th
This is free hand cutting and sewing. No rulers. No templates. The tools needed are minimal but you'll need a lot of fabric.

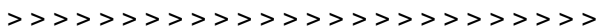

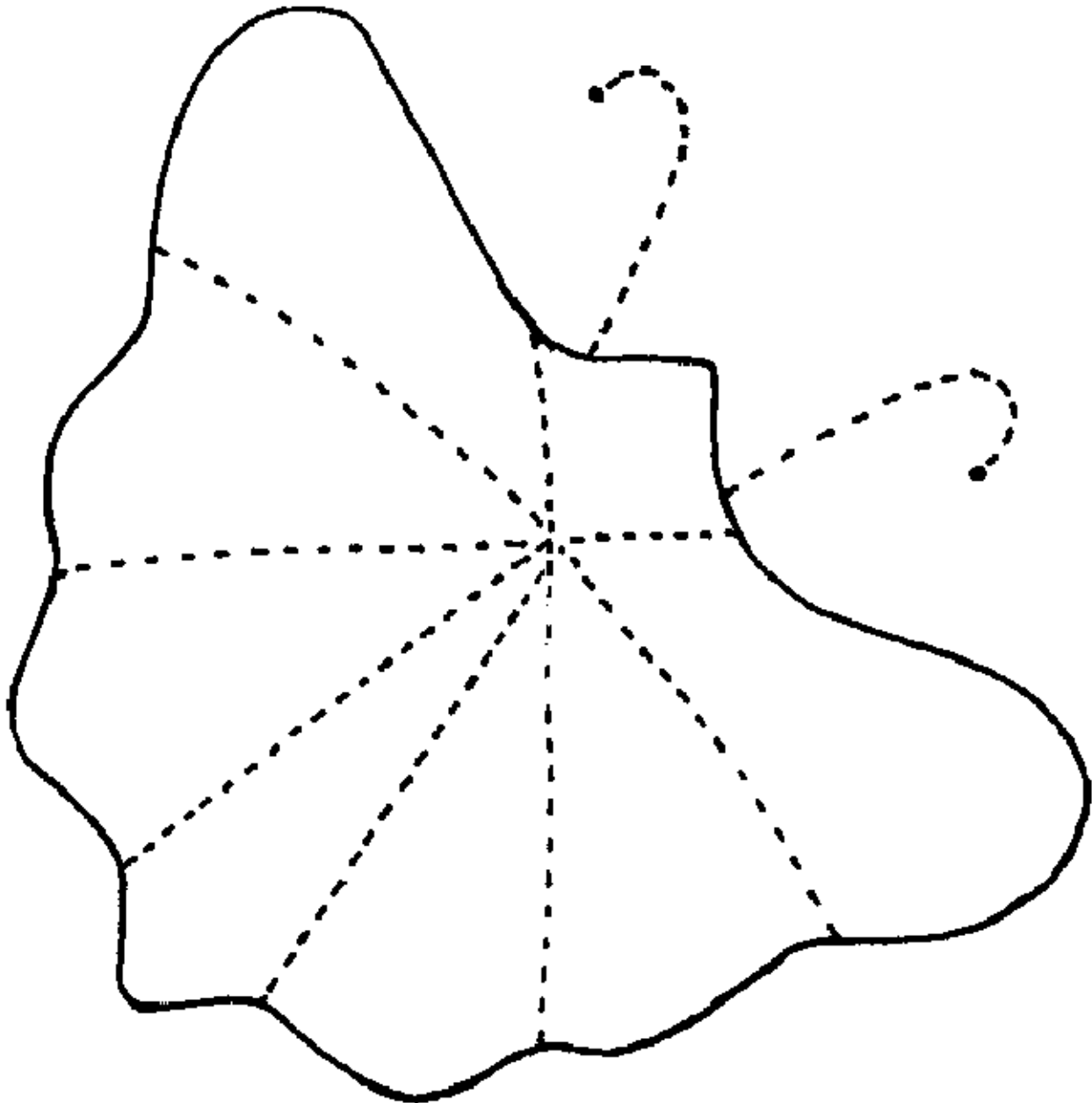
