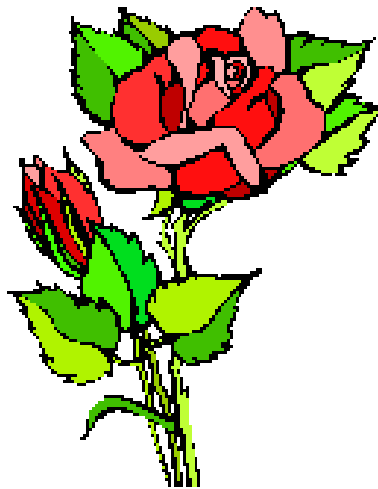

### **The Delta Kappa Gamma Key**

The Key is the emblem of membership in The Delta Kappa Society International. Members are required to purchase the Key pin immediately after initiation. The Key pin is worn in a vertical position over the heart; international, state, and chapter president's pin are worn directly below.

## **The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International**

### **Qualifications for Membership**

#### **Based on Revisions to the Constitution (Article III Section B)**

To be considered for active membership the member shall be a woman who is employed as a professional educator or who has been retired from an educational position. (Note: This means that the chapter decides on any restrictions on time of service. Women are eligible during their first year of service and any year of retirement)

1. Have had professional preparation.
2. Serve in an educational setting as an educator (See note below)
3. Be an educator who is employed or retired.
4. Have professional proficiency, with characteristics such as:
  - knowledge and skill in her area of educational work
  - active participation in professional groups at local, state, regional, national, and/or international levels
  - interest in professional growth revealed through reading, attending workshops, participating in educational travel/study and pursuing graduate study
  - willingness to participate in professional research and investigation
  - ethics in professional relationships
5. Have personal attributes such as:
  - initiative
  - open-mindedness
  - tactfulness
  - enthusiasm
6. Have been a contributing member of her community.

Each nominee (prospective member) must be endorsed by one member who has knowledge of her personal attributes as well as her professional qualifications and who submits a recommendation on the official recommendation form. NOTE: Women in educational work who deal with the instructional or educative process and who have had at least of experience in education may be invited to active membership in the Society. Eligible prospective members may be teachers, administrators, supervisors, librarians, psychologists, directors or counselors in public or private schools, in specialized institutions, in universities and colleges, and in schools of nursing and library training. Since the classifications are increasing from year to year, it is impossible to list all the categories of educational personnel eligible for membership. Teaching should be interpreted to mean instruction on a one-to-one basis as well as group instruction. The chapter should screen and evaluate the professional qualifications of each person recommended for membership.

## **Beta Alpha Chapter Mu State Chapter Rules**

### **A. Name**

The name of this chapter shall be Beta Alpha Chapter.  
(Constitution, ARTICLE I.)

### **B. Purposes**

The purposes of Beta Alpha Chapter shall be those stated in the (Constitution, ARTICLE II.)

### **C. Membership**

Membership in the chapter shall be in accordance with the (Constitution, ARTICLE III) The Mu State Bylaws, ARTICLE III, Sections A-B, C-D, the Mu State Standing Rules, G, 1-4, and Procedures, F, 1-2.)

The membership will be composed of active and reserve members of the chapter. Only active members can participate in the activities of the chapter, including voting privileges.

### **D. Finances**

1. International dues and fees shall be those stated in the (Constitution, ARTICLE IV). State dues shall be those stated in the Mu State Bylaws, ARTICLE IV, Section A.)
2. At the first meeting following July 1 each year, the chapter Finance Committee shall present a budget based upon the dues adopted by the chapter at the meeting. Approval of the budget shall be by majority vote of members present.
3. The chapter treasurer shall sign all checks. The chapter president may sign checks in the absence of the treasurer.
4. The president shall appoint an audit committee of not less than three members. The audit committee shall conduct an annual audit following the end of the fiscal year.
5. Revision of the budget shall be by majority vote of the members present at the meeting at which the revision is proposed.

## **E. Organization**

1. The chapter shall govern the conduct of its business in a manner consistent with the (Constitution, the Mu State Bylaws and Rules and Procedures.)
2. The chapter shall invite members from the territory assigned to Beta Alpha by the Executive Board of Mu State, that being the county of Broward.

## **F. Officers and Related Personnel**

1. The elected officers of the chapter shall be a president, a first vice-president, a recording secretary, and a corresponding secretary. A treasurer shall be appointed by the president and approved by the Executive Board.
2. A parliamentarian shall be appointed by the president.
3. Elections and terms of office shall be in accordance with the (Constitution, ARTICLE VI)
4. One nominee for each elective office shall be presented by the Nominations Committee. Other nominations may be made from the floor. No nominee shall be presented without her prior consent.
5. Elections shall be by ballot. If there is only one nominee for an office election may be by voice vote. Election of the officers shall be by majority vote of members present. The Nominations Committee together with the Membership Chair shall prepare the ballot and conduct the elections. (2010-2012 Guidelines for Chapter Membership Chairs Item 6)
6. Duties of the officers and related personnel

### **a. President**

1. The president shall perform those duties stated in the (Constitution, ARTICLE VI, Section B, 1, a, (1)-(9) and d, (20).)
2. The president shall serve as a member of the Mu State Executive Board. (Mu State Bylaws, ARTICLE V, Section A, 3).
3. The president shall work with the other Broward County Chapter presidents to coordinate plans for joint initiation and installation ceremonies.

## **b. Vice-President**

1. The first vice-president shall perform those duties stated in the (Constitution, ARTICLE VI, Section B, 1)
2. The vice-president shall be responsible for program planning.
3. The vice-president will succeed to the office of president and serve until the next regular election in the event of the resignation or death of the president.

## **c. Recording Secretary**

The recording secretary shall keep minutes of each meeting of the chapter and furnish the president with a copy of such minutes. She shall serve as secretary to the Executive Board.

## **d. Corresponding Secretary**

The corresponding secretary shall carry on such correspondence as may be delegated by the president.

## **e. Treasurer**

The treasurer shall perform those duties stated in the (Constitution, ARTICLE VI, Section b, 8, a, 1-2.)

## **G. Executive Board**

The members, duties, and meetings of the Executive Board shall be in accordance with the (Constitution, ARTICLE VII, Section C.)

## **H. Vacancies**

1. When a vacancy occurs in the office of the president, the vice president shall become the president.
2. In the event that a member holding an elective or appointed position at the chapter level, other than the vice-president, is unable to perform her duties, the position shall be declared vacant by the current chapter officers and successor named by the current chapter president.

## **I. Chapter Strategic Plan**

The president will work with the Executive Committee and membership to develop or revise a chapter strategic plan during her biennium

## **J. Meetings**

Regular meetings of the chapter shall be held four to six times a year. Executive Committee will meet two times a year. A quorum shall be those members present and voting.

## **K. Special Occasions**

1. Initiation shall be in accordance with the (Mu State Procedures Item C, 1-6.)
2. The Chapter Birthday Celebration shall be observed annually.
3. The Founders' Day observance shall be held every other year and shall be informative and inspirational.

## **L. Community Project**

Beta Alpha Chapter shall conduct community projects during each biennium.

## **M. Yearbook**

Electronic copies of the chapter yearbook shall be sent to the chapter members, the state president, state communications chair, editor of the state newsletter, and District V director after the December meeting each year. (Chapter Presidents' memo Fall Workshop 2010)

## **N. Newsletter**

1. The president shall appoint an editor of the chapter newsletter, The Beta Alpha Banner.
2. The newsletter shall be published four to six times a year.
3. Electronic copies of the chapter newsletter shall be sent to the chapter members, the state president, state communications chair, editor of the state newsletter, and the District V director. (Chapter Presidents' memo Fall Workshop 2010)

3. All committees shall be appointed by the president.

4. The president shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominations Committee.

5. The Nominations Committee shall be elected by the membership. The chairman shall be selected by the committee.

6. All other committees shall be governed in their work by the chapter level duties as stated in the current Handbook of the Society.

7. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for notifying other members in case of a member's illness, trouble, or need.

8. Ad Hoc Committees shall be appointed by the president as authorized by the Executive Board.

*\*\*NOTE: Those committees with \*\* indicate that the chapter is responsible to the state and international for the work of the committee.*

### **P. Amendments to Standing Rules**

The Standing Rules may be amended by majority vote of the members in attendance at any regular or called meeting, providing notice of a called meeting has been given all members at least 10 days in advance. Any Chapter Rule may be suspended for a specified period of time by majority vote of the members in attendance at a regular or called meeting, provided that notice of the called meeting has been given all members at least 10 days in advance.

#### Rules for Dissolution of a Chapter

Chapter dissolution shall be in compliance with the statutes of the state of Florida under which Mu State was chartered.

- d. Post an electronic copy of the yearbook on the chapter website.

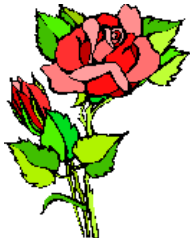
