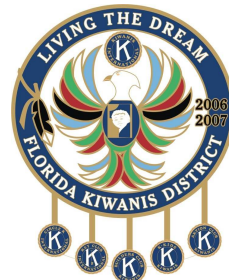
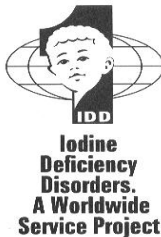

We are indebted to **LISA HARRISON**, Independent Associate of Pre-Paid Legal Services, Inc., our guest speaker last week, April 3, for furnishing a summary of her remarks to our breakfast meeting.

"Did you know there are five main areas of Identity Theft, and that your Financial Identity represents only 28% of possible theft? The other areas of Identity Theft include your Medical Social Security, Drivers Licenses and Criminal or Character information. It does not matter how diligent you may be in safeguarding your personal information because the latest breed of Identity Thieves are gaining access to your information in the Data Based storage of information. Your personal data exists in many public records such as the DMV, license bureaus, media announcements, phone book, medical records and in junk mail lists being circulated and sold for marketing opportunities. One in four Floridians will become a victim of Identity Theft in the next year. Do you have a plan when you become a victim?"

"Did you know that the Fair and Accurate Credit Transaction Act, which gives you a free credit report once a year, also states that if you do not notify the creditor within 60 days of the debt showing as yours that you are liable in full? This Act also reports that businesses that lose non-public information from their employee, client or vendor data files are liable for damages, will face fines and jail
