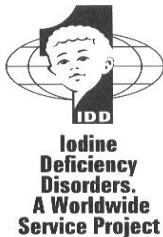

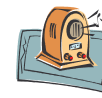

Staying Positive in a Challenging World

We may think that we live in more challenging times than our ancestors, but in olden times they had challenges too. Such as:

- Money issues
- Meeting house payments
- Weather issues—Not getting enough rain to water the crops
- There were wars and outlaws

The difference for us living on the planet now is that we are in the almost immediate global information age. This has its Pros and Cons like anything does. Personally, I feel this is the best time to be on the planet. Anything is possible if we have the desire and gumption to go for it. All the tools we need to be better and make this world better are available to us now.

The first step resides with us, the individual. We have to stay in balance - the opposite of stressed. When we're in balance, we are centered in ourselves. We can more easily stay calm in adverse situations. When we're stressed, we're prone to react and lash out when something triggers us.

Here are some tools to use to stay balanced:

1. Meditation
2. A daily breathing practice

3. Don't be news junky
4. Pray for someone (silently or out loud) rather than react in any situation
