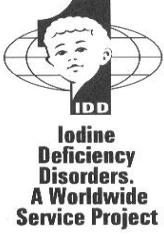

We are indebted to **STEVE PASTERNAK**, our breakfast meeting speaker last week, for providing a summary of his remarks from which the following is condensed. **KEN MORRISON** is a coowner with **STEVE** of Empire.



STEVE PASTERNAK

"There is more and more attention being paid to lighting today due to increased cost for electricity. While saving energy through lighting is nothing new, it seems today that people are more urgent to find ways to properly light their businesses while reducing their energy demand. Many of these changes have not come without problems, however, so it is important to have a good understanding of what those changes are and how to evaluate them for your own applications, both economically and functionally.



KEN MORRISON

"Simply put, lighting is the illumination of a space or area, whether artificially or naturally. The most widely used natural light sources are windows, skylights, open doors and open air spaces. The benefits are, once the sun is fully up, it is the best light to see in and it's free. The downside is that it's not always available when you need it. Also, skylights and windows require constant cleaning and scheduled maintenance and can be a cause of heat or cooling loss. In some areas these options may also pose a security risk and should be limited.

STEVE PASTERNAK, continued

"That brings us to artificial lighting. There are four major classifications of lighting in use today. These are incandescent, fluorescent, HID (high intensity discharge) and LED. Fiber Optic lighting is another, but still relatively new and not practical for most of us for regular lighting.

"One commonly used item that has benefited the most from LED lighting is exit signs. They are reasonably priced, very low energy consumption, and last about 10 years without bulb replacement. One LED exit sign can save you over \$125 a year in electricity. LED's and Fiber Optics will be an important part of energy efficient lighting in the future.

"Because of the heat generated, HID lighting fixtures are most widely used in high locations such as in school gymnasiums and ball fields. Fluorescent lighting is efficient, produces less heat and normally, when maintained properly, gives sufficient light in which to work,

"It is important to note that the new EPAC laws are planning to eliminate the use of the most common of lighting products; the incandescent light bulb in all its shapes and sizes."
