INTERVIEW POLICY

Student-athletes and coaches will be available for interviews before or after practice during the fall season. Although interviews are permitted after practice, interviews before practice are recommended.

If you wish to interview a particular player at a specific time, in person or by telephone, arrangements should be made through the Sports Media Relations Office at least 24 HOURS IN ADVANCE.

The best time to reach Coach Dave Shoji is between 8 a.m. and noon on weekdays.

Following matches, selected student-athletes and coach will be available following a "cooling off" period.

Giveaways & Prizes

Rainbow Wahine in Season-Openers

Hawai'i will open the program's 36th season of collegiate volleyball in 2009. UH is 28-7 all-time in season-openers, but have lost three of their last four. UH opened last season by losing to No. 1 ranked and eventual national champion Penn State.

UH is also 21-3 in season-openers at home, losing only their first-ever opener at home in 1976 (a loss to UCLA at the Neal Blaisdell Center), a five-game loss to Michigan in 2007 and a loss to No. 1 Penn State last year.

Hawai'i in the Chevron Rainbow Wahine Invitational

The Rainbow Wahine will be hosting their fifth invitational, playing this tournament in 2003, '04, '07 and '08 skipping the invitational in 2005 and '06. UH has a record of 8-2 in the four previous invitationals, winning the championship in 2003, '04 and last season.

None of the three visiting teams have appeared in any of the previous invitationals, although UCLA has played in the volleyball classic for three straight years.

'Bows In The Polls

The Rainbow Wahine are ranked No. 7 in the AVCA Preseason Coaches Top 25 Poll, which was released Aug. 18. Hawai'i has enjoyed a successful run of 251-consecutive weeks in the poll.

The Rainbow Wahine are also ranked No. 7 in the Volleyball Magazine Pre-season Poll. Both polls have the top-seven schools ranked the same, with Penn State No. 1, followed by Texas (2), Nebraska (3), Washington (4), Stanford (5) and Cal (6).

Hawai'i also has appeared in 380 of the 384 (.989) polls all-time. UH is third in poll appearances, behind only Nebraska and Stanford, who have both appeared in all 384 polls.

Hawai'i also ranks third to Stanford and Nebraska in weeks ranked in the top 10 (290) and rank third to Nebraska and UCLA in weeks ranked at No. 1 (48). In its 48 weeks as the No. 1 team in the country, UH boasts a 126-10 (.923) record.

Strong Preseason Schedule

Hawai'i has always scheduled tough competition early in the season, and 2009 is no different. The Rainbow Wahine will play six teams ranked in the AVCA Preseason

Coaches Top 25 Poll during non-conference play and will play another three teams that are receiving votes in the poll.

The first two tournaments of the season are packed with teams in the Top 25. UH faces No. 25 Santa Clara and No. 9 UCLA in the first tournament of the year, followed by matches against No. 20 Saint Louis, No. 2 Texas and No. 6 California in the second tournament.

UH Welcomes Seven Newcomers

The Rainbow Wahine brought in several new student-athletes for the 2009 season, including four transfers and three freshmen. The transfers include 6-4 middle Alexis Forsythe and 6-3 outside hitter Corinne Cascioppo, giving the Rainbow Wahine added height.

Freshman middle Kristiana Tuaniga is talented and brings height and depth in the middle, giving UH another weapon. Transfers Alex Griffiths and Alexis Robins bring defense, along with freshmen Kristina Kam and Paige Mitchell.

Looking to Step Up

Two young returnees for UH are looking to make an immediate impact in 2009. Sophomore Stephanie Ferrell and redshirt freshman Brittany Hewitt will be called upon to fill two open positions left by seniors.

Ferrell showed what she could do last season in limited action, averaging 2.27 kills per set and hitting nearly .300 in 66 sets played. Ferrell recorded a career-high 13 kills against Wyoming in her redshirt freshman year and will look to fill the outside hitter position. Hewitt is a 6-3 middle, who sat out last year, but gained valuable experience behind Amber Kaufman and Nickie Thomas. Hewitt was a two-time Idaho State Player of the Year in high school.

Rainbow Wahine Picked to Win 14th Straight WAC Title

UH was selected in a poll by the WAC's coaches to defend its crown in 2009 and take home its 14th-straight WAC regular-season title.

The Rainbow Wahine received eight of the nine first-place votes with New Mexico State earning the other first-place vote. Hawai'i earned 64 total points followed by New Mexico State with 57. Utah State was picked to finish third with 45 points, followed by Idaho in fourth with 41 points. Nevada was picked fifth with 37 points, while Fresno State was selected sixth with 29 points, just ahead of San Jose State with 28 points in seventh place. Boise State and Louisiana Tech rounded out the poll with 12 and 11 points, respectively.

Hawai'i won their ninth-straight WAC tournament title last season, advancing to all 11 championship matches. They have also won 13-straight WAC regular season titles, as they have won all conference regular season titles since joining the WAC in volleyball in 1996. The Rainbow Wahine have a record of 186-4 (.978) in conference play.

UH had an amazing streak of 114-consecutive wins in conference play that ran from Oct. 17, 1998 to Oct. 13, 2006, when the Rainbow Wahine fell to New Mexico State in five games in Las Cruces, N.M. The streak spanned seven years and 361 days, beating 17 different teams. The loss occurred on the 58th road match during the streak, on the 29th different road trip that the Rainbow Wahine had taken.

Danielson Named WAC Preseason Player Of The Year

The Preseason all-WAC volleyball team, as voted on by the nine head coaches, features five UH players, including sophomore Kanani Danielson, who was named WAC Preseason Player of the Year.

This is the fifth-straight season that a Rainbow Wahine player has earned the preseason honor with All-Americans Kanoe Kamana'o (2005, 2006) and Jamie Houston (2007, 2008) each earning the honor in back-to-back years.

Hawai'i placed the most student-athletes on the 12-player team with five. Along with Danielson, seniors Aneli Cubi-Otineru and Amber Kaufman, junior Dani Mafua and sophomore Stephanie Ferrell earned preseason honors. Cubi-Otineru and Kaufman were all first-team all-WAC selections in 2008, while Mafua was a second-team pick and Ferrell was on the All-Freshman Team.

Nevada placed two players on the team in juniors Lindsay Baldwin and Kylie Harrington, as did New Mexico State with seniors Krista Altermatt and Kelli Goodan. Utah State had two in juniors Chelsea Fowles and Christine Morrill and Idaho senior Anna McKinney rounded out the preseason squad.

Preseason Player of the Year:

Kanani Danielson, Hawai'i

HEAD COACH DAVE SHOJI

Dave Shoji has been a mainstay in both the realm of athletics in Hawai'i and in the volleyball community for the past 35 years. As Shoji is primed to become just the second women's volleyball coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 1,000 career victories this season, the legendary coach still remains one of the best in the country, leading his team to 14 consecutive conference titles and appearances in 10 of the last 11 NCAA regionals.

The honors have piled up for Shoji over the years. He is a nine-time conference and region Coach of the Year and was named the national Coach of the Year in 1982. Shoji was named to the list of all-time great coaches by USA Volleyball in 2002. He has also been inducted into Hawai'i Sports Hall of Fame and was named coach of the NCAA 25th Anniversary team.

In 1975, a young Shoji took over the reins of the UH women's volleyball program. He was just 28 years old with no clue that he would turn a one-year-old program into a national powerhouse for the next three decades.

The team was coming off a 9-1 campaign in 1974 that ended with the Rainbow Wahine falling to UCLA in the national title match at the AIAW Championship.

In Shoji's first four years at the helm of the program, he took the team to two more national title matches before he finally broke through to take the title in 1979 with a five-game victory over Utah State in the AIAW finals.

It was the school's first-ever team national championship and a sign of great things to come for the young program.

In 1981, Shoji became UH's first full-time coach for a women's program. He led the team to another national title, this time in the new NCAA Tournament in 1982, beating the USC Women of Troy in a come-from-behind five-game thriller.

Shoji would lead the team to another title in 1983 with a straight-set win over UCLA, becoming the first school to win back-to-back NCAA championships.

The Rainbow Wahine again returned to the national championship match in 1987, capping a 37-2 season with a sweep of Stanford for the program's fourth national title and third NCAA title.

The team lost to Texas in the 1988 national championship match, then went through a stretch of five frustrating losses in six years to rival Long Beach State in the NCAA Regionals, holding them out of the NCAA Championships.

UH looked primed to return to the final four in 1995, going through the season undefeated at 29-0. After winning their regional match over Arizona State, Hawai'i was set for a national championship run. But Michigan State dealt a heart-breaking blow to those plans, coming back from being down two games to none, to hold the Rainbow Wahine out of the NCAA Championships.

Hawai'i would finally make that return in 1996, dropping just one set in the first four matches of the NCAA Tournament. But another long-time nemesis of the Rainbow Wahine, Stanford, stopped UH's bid for a national title, sweeping Hawai'i in the championship match.

The Rainbow Wahine experienced another great run of success that started with the 1998 season, as transfer Heather Bown led the team from a perennial Top 25 squad and NCAA Tournament team to again a national-title contender.

Hawai'i made its way to the NCAA Regional Final in 1998 and was one of the top seeds in the 1999 tournament before a scrappy Texas A&M team beat UH in the regionals.

Following that season, Louisiana-native Kim Willoughby came to the program, joining Lily Kahumoku, who was already establishing herself as one of the best players in the country, to form a dynamic duo that would lead the team to great success for another four years. From 2000-03, the Rainbow Wahine advanced to the NCAA Championship national semifinal match three times, while Shoji's 2003 senior class became the winningest class in school history.

Under Shoji, UH volleyball finished in the Top 10 in 22 of the 27 final AVCA polls, and ranked in the top five 14 times. They have made it to the post-season in all but one year, finishing with a winning record in all 34 seasons.

The 63-year-old was also responsible for the start of the men's volleyball program in 1978. Shoji served as the men's coach at UH from 1978-85, compiling a record of 81-48, leading the team to a Western Collegiate Volleyball Conference title in 1980.

Shoji was a three-sport athlete at Upland High School in California, playing football, basketball and baseball. He then moved on to UC Santa Barbara, where he played baseball for a year, along with three years of volleyball. He earned All-America honors as a volleyball player in 1968 and '69. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1969.

After spending two years in the U.S. Army, Shoji returned to Hawai'i to coach the Kalani High School girls' and boys' volleyball teams. He then took an assistant coaching job at Punahou School.

Shoji and his wife, the former Mary Tennefos, reside in Manoa. They have three children. Cobey, 30, works at Stanford University. Kawika, 20, and Erik, 18, play for the Stanford men's volleyball team.

Western Michigan will be making its second trip to Honolulu, having last played in the Wahine Classic in 2005. UH is 3-0 all-time against the Broncos, beating them twice on the road, before facing them at the Stan Sheriff Center. The Broncos are coming off a 28-7 season, which included their first trip to the NCAA Regionals since 1987. Under head coach Colleen Munson, they have had the best four-year stretch in school history. The Broncos are 90-43 under Munson in four years.

The Broncos return all their starters from last years team, including junior Michelle Moore, who recorded 502 kills, averaging 3.89 kills per set. Katie Eberling averaged 2.77 kills per set and setter Jillian Mitchell led the offense with 11.40 assists per set.

Moore was first team all-MAC, while Caitlin Strimel was the MAC Defensive Player of the Year and Mitchell was MAC Setter of the Year. Mitchell was also named AVCA All-Mideast Region Honorable Mention.

Scouting the Broncos

Santa Clara heads back to the island for the second time in three years. The Broncos visited the Stan Sheriff Center in 2007, participating in the Volleyball Challenge. UH is 8-0 all-time versus Santa Clara. Last season Santa Clara finished 18-10 and in fourth place in the West Coast Conference. The Broncos advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, before falling to Washington.

This year the Broncos enter the season with a preseason ranking of No. 25 by the AVCA Coaches Poll. The Broncos return three starters from last year's team, including all-WCC freshman team member Tanya Schmidt and honorable mention all-WCC Lindsey Davigeadono. Schmidt hit .301 on the season and averaged 1.74 kills per set and totaled 65 blocks. Davigeadono set last season, but can play outside as well. She recorded 1,063 assists on the season.

Head coach Jon Wallace enters his 11th season and has led the Broncos to 10 straight NCAA appearances. Wallace earned his 200th victory last season and is 213-88 in 10 seasons.

Scouting the Bruins

UCLA returns to the Stan Sheriff Center for the 67th meeting all-time between the two schools. The Bruins are coming off a 22-11 season and a loss in the NCAA Regionals a year ago. UCLA is preseason ranked No. 9 by the AVCA Coaches Poll.

The Bruins return a core group of middles that tower over the competition. Sophomore Amanda Gil is 6-6 and averaged 2.54 kills and 1.46 blocks per set as freshman. Sophomore middle blocker Katie Camps stands 6-5 and averaged 2.15 kills and 1.03 blocks as a freshman last year. The Bruins also return junior outside hitter Dicey McGraw, who averaged 2.86 kills per set.

The long rivalry between UH and UCLA goes back to 1974, the first year that Hawai'i played a collegiate schedule. Since then, the two programs have played at least once every year with the Rainbow Wahine holding a slight 34-32 lead in the all-time series. UCLA has won the last four meetings between the two schools.
