Danielson Named WAC Player of the Week

Sophomore outside hitter Kanani Danielson was named WAC Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 24-30. This is the first WAC Player of the Week honor of the season for Danielson and the second of her career.

The sophomore outside hitter tallied 54 kills, 19 digs and 11 blocks over three matches en route to earning Most Outstanding Player honors at the Chevron Rainbow Wahine Invitational. Danielson averaged a league-best 5.40 kills on .408 hitting as she led Hawai'i to the tournament title with wins over No. 28 Western Michigan, No. 25 Santa Clara and No. 9 UCLA.

Danielson, who led the Rainbow Wahine in kills in all three matches, tied a career high with 22 kills against Santa Clara. She also tied her career high with five blocks against both Santa Clara and Western Michigan. In the final match of the week against UCLA, Danielson hit .414, posting 16 kills in three sets.

Fast Start For Rainbow Wahine; No. 4 in AVCA Poll

UH swept the Chevron Rainbow Wahine Invitational last week, going 3-0 to open the season for the first time since 2004. The Rainbow Wahine jumped to No. 4 in this week's AVCA Coaches Poll, its highest ranking since being picked No. 4 in the 2005 preseason poll.

Ferrell Comes Up With Career Night Against No. 9 UCLA

Sophomore outside hitter Stephanie Ferrell had a career match against No. 9 UCLA on Sunday, Aug. 30. Ferrell recorded 14 kills and eight digs, both career highs. Ferrell had four kills in the first set and five kills in sets 2 and 3. Her previous career-high was 13 kills set last season against Wyoming.

Kaufman Unloads On No. 25 Santa Clara

Senior middle Amber Kaufman hit a career-high .765 against No. 25 Santa Clara on Saturday, Aug. 29. Kaufman tied a career-high with 13 kills, which came on 17 attempts and no errors in the match. Over the weekend, Kaufman hit .426, averaging 2.4 kills per set and had four aces.

Aces Wild For Cubi-Otineru

Senior outside hitter Aneli Cubi-Otineru combined for 12 aces over three matches, including tying a career-high five aces twice. Cubi-Otineru served five aces against No. 9 UCLA on Aug. 29 and two nights earlier served five aces against Western Michigan. She had two aces against No. 25 Santa Clara in between. She averaged 1.20 aces per set over the weekend.

22nd Annual Hawaiian Airlines Wahine Classic

UH enters the 22nd annual Hawaiian Airlines Wahine Classic with a 3-0 record and will face some tough competition over the three-day event. The tournament features No. 19 Saint Louis, No. 2 Texas and No. 10 California. This will be the first HAL tournament for Saint Louis and California, while Texas has played in the HAL twice. Overall, UH has won the tournament nine times. Last season the Rainbow Wahine went 1-2 and finished in third place.

Freshman Hewitt Breaks Out

Redshirt freshman Brittany Hewitt showed UH fans what she has been working on over the past year. Hewitt recorded a double-double with 10 kills and 11 blocks in just her second match of her career against No. 25 Santa Clara on Aug. 29. Hewitt hit

.467 with 10 kills in 15 attempts and added 10 block assists and one solo block against the Broncos. Hewitt followed up the Santa Clara match with four kills and five blocks against No. 9 UCLA. After her first weekend of competition, Hewitt averaged 1.67 kills and 2.00 blocks per set.

Kaufman Versus Hooker, On The Court

The last time Amber Kaufman and Destinee Hooker were together in the same competition, it wasn't on the volleyball court. Hooker is the top outside hitter for No. 2 Texas, while Kaufman is the top middle for No. 4 Hawai'i. But in June, the two were in the finals of the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Arkansas. Hooker won the NCAA Championship, while Kaufman finished in third. This will be the first meeting between the two on the volleyball court.

UH Players Named All-Tourney; Danielson MOP

Kanani Danielson was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Chevron Rainbow Wahine Invitational, following UH's sweep of the tournament. Senior Aneli Cubi-Otineru and junior Dani Mafua were named all-tournament. UCLA Amanda Gil and Lauren Cook were joined by Santa Clara Krista Kelley and Western Michigan's Michelle Moore to round out the team. This is the second tournament Danielson has been named MOP, including last season's Honolulu Advertiser Challenge. Last year Danielson and was also named to the Chevron Rainbow Wahine Invitational all-tournament team.

Rainbow Wahine in Season-Openers

Hawai'i opened the program's 36th season of collegiate volleyball with a 3-0 start. UH is 29-7 all-time in season-openers. UH is also 22-3 in season-openers at home, losing only their first-ever opener at home in 1976 (a loss to UCLA at the Neal Blaisdell Center), a five-game loss to Michigan in 2007 and a loss to No. 1 Penn State in 2008.

Hawai'i in the Chevron Rainbow Wahine Invitational

The Rainbow Wahine won the Chevron Rainbow Wahine Invitational for the fourth time in the first five years of the tournament. UH won the inaugural tournament in 2003 and then again in 2004. After the tournament wasn't played for two years, UH came back and won the tournament in 2008. The Rainbow Wahine are 11-2 all-time in the tournament.

'Bows In The Polls

The Rainbow Wahine are ranked No. 4 this week the AVCA Preseason Coaches Top 25 Poll released on Monday, Aug. 31. Hawai'i has enjoyed a successful run of 252-consecutive weeks in the poll. The Rainbow Wahine are also ranked No. 4 in the Volleyball Magazine Poll released Tuesday, Sept. 1.

Hawai'i also has appeared in 381 of the 385 (.989) polls all-time. UH is third in poll appearances, behind only Nebraska and Stanford, who have both appeared in all 385 polls.

Hawai'i also ranks third to Stanford and Nebraska in weeks ranked in the top 10 (291) and rank third to Nebraska and UCLA in weeks ranked at No. 1 (48). In its 48 weeks as the No. 1 team in the country, UH boasts a 126-10 (.923) record.

Rainbow Wahine Picked to Win 14th Straight WAC Title

UH was selected in a poll by the WAC's coaches to defend its crown in 2009 and take home its 14th-straight WAC regular-season title.

The Rainbow Wahine received eight of the nine first-place votes with New Mexico State earning the other first-place vote. Hawai'i earned 64 total points followed by New Mexico State with 57. Utah State was picked to finish third with 45 points, followed by Idaho in fourth with 41 points. Nevada was picked fifth with 37 points, while Fresno State was selected sixth with 29 points, just ahead of San Jose State with 28 points in seventh place. Boise State and Louisiana Tech rounded out the poll with 12 and 11 points, respectively.

Hawai'i won their ninth-straight WAC tournament title last season, advancing to all 11 championship matches. They have also won 13-straight WAC regular season titles, as they have won all conference regular season titles since joining the WAC in volleyball in 1996. The Rainbow Wahine have a record of 186-4 (.978) in conference play.

UH had an amazing streak of 114-consecutive wins in conference play that ran from Oct. 17, 1998 to Oct. 13, 2006, when the Rainbow Wahine fell to New Mexico State in five games in Las Cruces, N.M. The streak spanned seven years and 361 days, beating 17 different teams. The loss occurred on the 58th road match during the streak, on the 29th different road trip that the Rainbow Wahine had taken.

Danielson Named WAC Preseason Player Of The Year

The Preseason all-WAC volleyball team, as voted on by the nine head coaches, features five UH players, including sophomore Kanani Danielson, who was named WAC Preseason Player of the Year.

This is the fifth-straight season that a Rainbow Wahine player has earned the preseason honor with All-Americans Kanoe Kamana`o (2005, 2006) and Jamie Houston (2007, 2008) each earning the honor in back-to-back years.

Hawai'i placed the most student-athletes on the 12-player team with five. Along with Danielson, seniors Aneli Cubi-Otineru and Amber Kaufman, junior Dani Mafua

and sophomore Stephanie Ferrell earned preseason honors. Cubi-Otineru and Kaufman were all first-team all-WAC selections in 2008, while Mafua was a second-team pick and Ferrell was on the All-Freshman Team.

Nevada placed two players on the preseason team in juniors Lindsay Baldwin and Kylie Harrington, as did New Mexico State with seniors Krista Altermatt and Kelli Goodan. Utah State also had two selections in juniors Chelsea Fowles and Christine Morrill. Senior Anna McKinney of Idaho rounded out the preseason squad. Five teams placed at least one player on the preseason all-WAC team. Five players are returning first-team all-WAC honorees, while five student-athletes are returning second-team picks.

Strong Preseason Schedule

Hawai'i has always scheduled tough early in the season, and 2009 is no different. The Rainbow Wahine will play six teams ranked in the AVCA Preseason Coaches Top 25 Poll during non-conference play and will play another three teams that are receiving votes in the poll.

UH Welcomes Seven Newcomers

The Rainbow Wahine brought in several new student-athletes for the 2009 season, including four transfers and three freshmen. The transfers include 6-4 middle Alexis Forsythe and 6-3 outside hitter Corinne Cascioppo, giving the Rainbow Wahine added height.

Freshman middle Kristiana Tuaniga is talented and brings height and depth in the middle, giving UH another weapon. Transfers Alex Griffiths and Alexis Robins bring defense, along with freshmen Kristina Kam and Paige Mitchell.

Looking to Step Up

Two young returnees for UH are looking to make an immediate impact in 2009. Sophomore Stephanie Ferrell and redshirt freshman Brittany Hewitt will be called upon to fill two open positions left by seniors last year. Ferrell showed what she could do last season in limited action, averaging 2.27 kills per set and hitting nearly .300 in 66 sets played. Ferrell recorded a career-high 13 kills against Wyoming in her redshirt freshman year and will look to fill the outside hitter position. Hewitt is a 6-3 middle, who sat out last year, but gained valuable experience behind Amber Kaufman and Nickie Thomas. Hewitt was a two-time Idaho State Player of the Year in high school.

Dave Shoji has been a mainstay in both the realm of athletics in Hawai'i and in the volleyball community for the past 35 years. As Shoji is primed to become just the second women's volleyball coach in NCAA Division I history to reach 1,000 career victories this season, the legendary coach still remains one of the best in the country, leading his team to 14 consecutive conference titles and appearances in 10 of the last 11 NCAA regionals.

The honors have piled up for Shoji over the years. He is a nine-time conference and region Coach of the Year and was named the national Coach of the Year in 1982. Shoji was named to the list of all-time great coaches by USA Volleyball in 2002. He has also been inducted into Hawai'i Sports Hall of Fame and was named coach of the NCAA 25th Anniversary team.

In 1975, a young Shoji took over the reins of the UH women's volleyball program. He was just 28 years old with no clue that he would turn a one-year-old program into a national powerhouse for the next three decades.

The team was coming off a 9-1 campaign in 1974 that ended with the Rainbow Wahine falling to UCLA in the national title match at the AIAW Championship.

In Shoji's first four years at the helm of the program, he took the team to two more national title matches before he finally broke through to take the title in 1979 with a five-game victory over Utah State in the AIAW finals.

It was the school's first-ever team national championship and a sign of great things to come for the young program.

In 1981, Shoji became UH's first full-time coach for a women's program. He led the team to another national title, this time in the new NCAA Tournament in 1982, beating the USC Women of Troy in a come-from-behind five-game thriller.

Shoji would lead the team to another title in 1983 with a straight-set win over UCLA, becoming the first school to win back-to-back NCAA championships.

The Rainbow Wahine again returned to the national championship match in 1987, capping a 37-2 season with a sweep of Stanford for the program's fourth national title and third NCAA title.

The team lost to Texas in the 1988 national championship match, then went through a stretch of five frustrating losses in six years to rival Long Beach State in the NCAA Regionals, holding them out of the NCAA Championships.

UH looked primed to return to the final four in 1995, going through the season undefeated at 29-0. After winning their regional match over Arizona State, Hawai'i was set for a national championship run. But Michigan State dealt a heart-breaking blow to those plans, coming back from being down two games to none, to hold the Rainbow Wahine out of the NCAA Championships.

Hawai'i would finally make that return in 1996, dropping just one set in the first four matches of the NCAA Tournament. But another long-time nemesis of the Rainbow Wahine, Stanford, stopped UH's bid for a national title, sweeping Hawai'i in the championship match.

The Rainbow Wahine experienced another great run of success that started with the 1998 season, as transfer Heather Bown led the team from a perennial Top 25 squad and NCAA Tournament team to again a national-title contender.

Hawai'i made its way to the NCAA Regional Final in 1998 and was one of the top seeds in the 1999 tournament before a scrappy Texas A&M team beat UH in the regionals.

Following that season, Louisiana-native Kim Willoughby came to the program, joining Lily Kahumoku, who was already establishing herself as one of the best players in the country, to form a dynamic duo that would lead the team to great success for another four years. From 2000-03, the Rainbow Wahine advanced to the NCAA Championship national semifinal match three times, while Shoji's 2003 senior class became the winningest class in school history.

Under Shoji, UH volleyball finished in the Top 10 in 22 of the 27 final AVCA polls, and ranked in the top five 14 times. They have made it to the post-season in all but one year, finishing with a winning record in all 34 seasons.

The 63-year-old was also responsible for the start of the men's volleyball program in 1978. Shoji served as the men's coach at UH from 1978-85, compiling a record of 81-48, leading the team to a Western Collegiate Volleyball Conference title in 1980.

Shoji was a three-sport athlete at Upland High School in California, playing football, basketball and baseball. He then moved on to UC Santa Barbara, where he played baseball for a year, along with three years of volleyball. He earned All-America honors as a volleyball player in 1968 and '69. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1969.

After spending two years in the U.S. Army, Shoji returned to Hawai'i to coach the Kalani High School girls' and boys' volleyball teams. He then took an assistant coaching job at Punahou School.

Shoji and his wife, the former Mary Tennefos, reside in Manoa. They have three children. Cobey, 30, works at Stanford University. Kawika, 20, and Erik, 18, play for the Stanford men's volleyball team.
