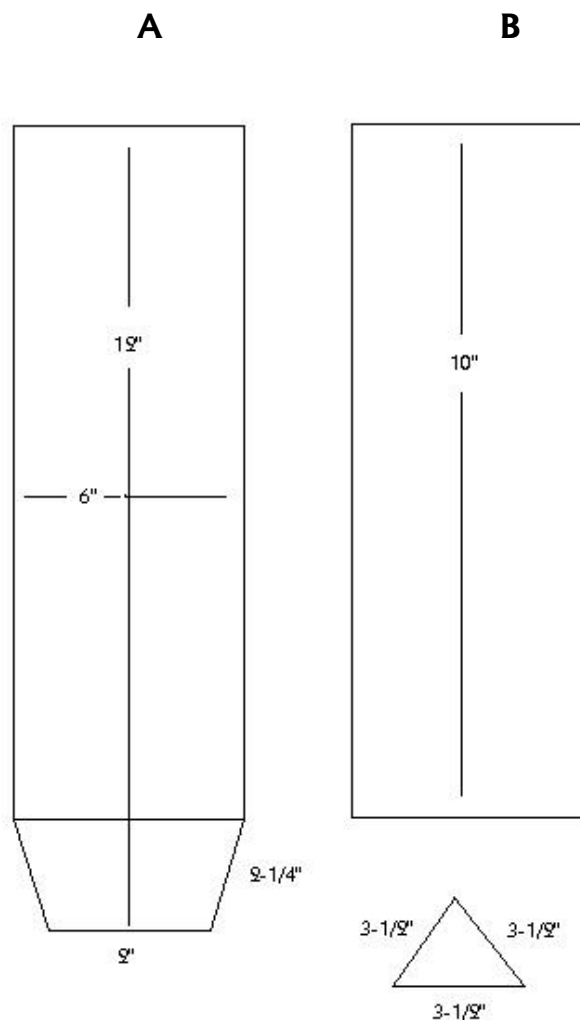


# Needle Roll



Old Kimono Silk or other printed fabric

Lining fabric

Timtex and wearable quilt batting

Felt

Ribbon

Thread

Piece A will be the flap that will cover the entire needle roll. Piece B will form a triangular 'case' for carrying sewing supplies. Both pieces will be 6" wide finished.

Cut all pieces adding a 1/4" seam allowance. The large piece (A) is lined with wearable quilt batting. The shorter piece (B) plus the triangular end pieces are each lined with 2 pieces of Timtex. Cut 2 of the triangle end pieces (e.g. 4 timtex). You must also cut lining pieces for each piece.

Lay the pieces lining face up, fabric face down. Fold the ribbon for securing the needle roll and lay it on the seam in the middle of the smaller end of A. Leave at least 1-2 feet of ribbon on each side of the attachment. The ribbon should be laying between the fabric and the lining, on the inside of

the fabric sandwich. If you want felt needle holders, you should have already attached 2 pieces of felt, stitching each in the middle so they each form 2 flaps, on the right side of the lining closer to the straight end of piece A. Each piece of felt should measure about 5" x 3-1/4". The second piece of felt should be sewn at least 1-1/2" - 2" from the end of the fabric. Remember you will be turning this inside out, so be sure to keep all free fabric and attachments away from the seams.

Stitch the seams. You can complete all this stitching by machine. Leave open one end of piece B and the straight end of piece A. Leave one side open for turning the triangular pieces. Trim edges and turn right-side out. After turning the triangular pieces, insert 2 pieces of Timtex and slip stitch the opening closed. Insert batting in piece A and 2 sheets of Timtex in piece B. Insert the unfinished end of piece A into the unfinished end of piece B. Fold the unfinished fabric edge of piece B under on both sides, and slip stitch or machine stitch closed. Set one of the triangular pieces on the edge of piece B, lining up one point to the seam line between piece A and B. Slip stitch two sides of the triangular piece to piece B. Do the same on the other side. Fold the end of piece B to form the triangular 'case' and wrap the flap (piece A) around it. Secure with ribbon. Enjoy!
