

AGBA Policies:

- No practices are to be held over Christmas break or when school is not in session. 1/06
- If school is cancelled due to weather, all AGBA practices are also canceled. 1/06
- If there are enough players for two teams in the same grade, the players will be divided by equal talent per position. A qualified person or persons will be in charge of dividing the talent equally to form the 2 teams. If there is a coach who has a daughter playing in the respective grade, the daughter will be assigned to the team that he/she coaches. 9/05
- If there are two teams in the same grade and one team is short of players for a tournament the policy is that coaches work collaboratively and act with discretion to take a player of similar ability that plays the position needed for a team to be competitive at a tournament, and then rotate through the players of the needed position. 1/06
- If there is one team short a player or players for a tournament then the policy to play up a grade is that coaches work collaboratively and act with discretion to take a player of similar ability that plays the position needed for a team to be competitive at a tournament. 1/06
- Player conduct/coaches roles: Un-sportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated. At coaches'/board discretion, first offense should result in half to a whole game suspension. Second offense/continued un-sportsmanlike conduct will result in a meeting with the parent, player, and board with a possible banishment from the organization. 1/06
- Board member conduct: If a board member speaks out in public negatively about the AGBA program, coaches, or players there will be a one warning system. If the problem continues after the first warning, the board will motion and vote on an immediate dismissal. Everyone needs to support the program and work towards the positive aspect of the program. 1/06
- If the board votes to remove a player from the AGBA program due to violations of the Good Sportsmanship policy, the financial policy is no dues will be refunded. 1/06
- If a player voluntarily quits her team, the AGBA will not prorate and refund dues that were paid. 1/06
- Refunds are for AGBA related injuries and will be up to 50% of the registration fee, less uniform cost, up to the first team tournament. 5/06
- After the Parent informational child sign up night, players will have until Oct. 1st to sign up for the AGBA. On Oct. 2nd the number of teams will be decided. If we have 16 or more players from one grade there will be two teams if we have 2 full time coaches per team. 1/06

- During tournaments, all communication with referees is to go through the head coach only. MN League Rules state that the coach's assistant should always be sitting on the bench during the game. 1/06
- The fiscal year runs from June 1st – May 31st. 3/06
- Election of Officers will take place each year at the May Board Meeting. 3/06
- Each team coach must consent to a background check. The background check results must be approved by the board for the coach to coach. 3/06
- Each team coach must read/understand/sign the AGBA's sexual misconduct policy for him/her to coach. 3/06
- All teams will have 1 head coach and 1 assistant coach. 3/06
- There shall be 2 adults in the gym during practice at all times. 3/06
- Only two coach background checks per team will be paid for per year by the AGBA, (head coach/assistant coach). 3/06
- Any student applying for the AGBA Senior Scholarship must be free of any Minnesota State High School league rule violation from 4th grade through 12th grade. Any board member that has a child applying for the scholarship or is a varsity girl's basketball coach are not allowed to vote and must be excused during the voting process. 5/06
- If a player is sick and misses school for the day, they will not be allowed to practice that evening. 9/08
