Reports to: Day Camp Older Girl Coordinator
Term: One year, with reappointment
Purpose: Assist in the delivery of age-appropriate activities to campers at Day Camp in accordance with the standards and policies established by the Girl Scouts of Minnesota and Wisconsin River Valleys and the Girl Scouts of the USA.

Responsibilities:

1. Complete all required training as sponsored by both River Valleys' and the Day Camp Leadership Team.
2. Maintain ongoing communication with the Older Girl Coordinator.
3. Submit any required paperwork to the River Valleys' Staff and Day Camp Leadership Team in a timely manner.
4. Ensure the Girl Scout Mission, Promise, & Law are the basis for decision-making, delivery, and camper experience of the Day Camp Program.
5. Act as role model and friend for all campers.
6. Help campers feel comfortable in the camp community by encouraging them to act with courage, confidence, and character.
7. Assist with the delivery of programming as outlined by the Program Manager and Older Girl Coordinator.
8. Make camp fun for campers.
9. Have a strong background in Day Camp programming including songs, games, and camp traditions.
10. Have knowledge of day camp procedures and expectations; be able to explain to campers.
11. Help teach outdoor skills and appreciation of the outdoors.
12. Assume other responsibilities as requested by the Unit Leader and Older Girl Coordinator.
13. Follow all River Valleys and GSUSA policies, standards, and procedures.

Qualifications:

1. Register as a member of GSUSA.
2. Accept the beliefs and principles of the Girl Scout Movement.
3. Commitment to speak and act in a manner consistent with the Girl Scout Mission, Promise, Law and Values.
4. Practice welcoming and inclusive behavior toward people of all ages, races, religions, cultures, abilities, and economic backgrounds.
5. Be at least 12 years old and successfully complete 6th grade.
6. Complete all trainings as required for leadership privileges through the Girl Scouts of Minnesota and Wisconsin River Valleys.
7. Complete all trainings as required for leadership privileges through the sponsoring Service Unit.
8. Have a genuine liking for girls; understanding and respecting their individual differences.
9. Access to email on a regular, consistent basis.
10. Ability to be flexible; evaluate and make desirable changes.
11. Ability to make good judgments regarding safety expectations.
