Emergency telephone calls: Please do not place calls to Scouts or leaders except for emergency situations. The camp number is 715-354-3841. All calls should be person-to-person and allow for several hours for a return message. We strongly discourage boys from making calls home. It is very disruptive of their lives in camp and leads to homesickness.

Medical care: A camp health officer is a regular member of the camp staff. In the event of a serious accident, the leaders of Troop 337 will make immediate decisions about care for your son, and we will contact you as soon as possible. The Troop has emergency health care insurance.

Religious services: If your son regularly attends church we expect him to attend church services on Sunday morning. Boys who do not attend church will meet with a leader to discuss the meaning of the Scout Oath and Scout Law in their personal lives.
