Minutes for April 11, 2006

The minutes were approved as printed. Peter Mosca gave the treasurer's report indicating a balance of \$2483.57 inclusive of the 50/50 monies.

John Savage introduced Randy Bowman of the Bolivar Speedway. This Friday night our Chapter is invited to present a fly-over for the Bolivar RACE NIGHT program. Pilots are to meet at 6:00 for preflight with the flight over the speedway at 7:00. Peter Hauer will coordinate the event with Randy Bowman. Hopefully the National Anthem and the Prayer for the race will be completed as our pilots fly over then circle around the Bolivar Speedway and fly over again. Randy will introduce the pilots in the order they are flying, and a promo for our June Open House will be announced.

Membership: Charlie Hendrickson reported that we have some new members: Charlie Powell and Jim and Mary Berline.

Fly Outs and other Flying Data for our Calendars:

Friday, April 14: Seven aircrafts will fly over the Bolivar Speedway. Meet at 6:00 for preflight. Peter Hauer will coordinate event.

Saturday, April 15: Flyout for Hot Springs, Arkansas. Meet at 9:00 am for preflight.

Saturday, April 22: The Pull Out Ministries have 22 students who have met their program criteria and have permission forms signed. Flying volunteers will meet at 9:30 a.m., and flights will begin at 10:00 extending through 12:30. The rain date for this event will be Saturday, April 29. Arlene Ferguson and Grace McVickers visited with the chapter to let us know how many students are to be involved, and the students are extremely excited about this event. Students must come with their parent(s) to the airport.

Monday, April 24: AOPA Safety Seminar will be meeting at the Lamplighter Inn. There will be some great door prizes.

Saturday, May 13: WINGS program with ground school at 8:00 a.m. with flying immediately following. Dinner will be about 4:00 p.m. at Dean's Hangar. See note below in the Safety Report.

Saturday, June 3: Bartleville Fly-In and program will have Bi-wings, old timers, WW I airplanes.

Saturday, June 10: Open House for Bolivar Airport. The program will include flour drops, Sky diving, lots of activities. We will not have individual flights (Plane Rides) on Saturday. Local Chapter will sponsor "individual rides" on the day before (Friday, June 9).

Saturday, June 17: Fayetteville Air Show. The runway closes from 10-5 so make sure that you get there early.

Saturday, July 1: Oselola Independence Day celebration. This will be an evening fly over. Peter Hauer will give more information as the time approaches.

Safety Report: Jonathan Rimington gave a personal thank you to the members of Bolivar Chapter for their continued training to become better pilots. March 31 ends the contest year, so get your certifications completed and sent in. On January 14, seven pilots completed their wings, and nine completed the program during the program year. The 2005-2006 competition is closed, and we are working on the 2006-2007 competition. We have set a positive trend for those in the state. The Wings process is a very positive experience; the CFI signs off in your log-book that you have received appropriate training in three diverse areas. Passing through the Wings Safety Program can take the place of the Bi-annual Flight Review.

The next WINGS program is set for May 13. Ground school will begin at 8am, the rest of the day is in the air. We will have barbecued rib eye, baked potatoes etc.

Scholarship Committee Report: Don Baker reported that we had one applicant who is an excellent choice, and we will vote on him at our May meeting. See Rex Warren if you would like to see the application. We are excited to get such a strong candidate for this scholarship.

New Business:
