On Monday, June 9<sup>th</sup>, the Bolivar Liberator Chapter experienced the second loss this week when Charles Hendrickson passed away. Charles, or as we knew him, "Charlie", was the engine that drove Bolivar to move their airport from downtown Bolivar on the west side of the town (where the paved runway and the grass strip were less than 2500 feet in length) out east of the city, with a new paved runway that's 4000x75 feet, with a separate taxiway, new hangars, a FBO with restaurant, and city which recognizes the vital importance of General Aviation to its economic health and growth.

Besides being the city Alderman who advocated for the new M17, he served as the city director on the Airport Board. Charlie's enthusiasm for GA culminated with him earning his PPASEL when he was seventy years young. He and his surviving wife, Cloda, were regular customers at the restaurant.
