Minutes for June 12, 2006

A correction to last month's meeting: The Andersons are from Maryland and not Wisconsin. Minutes were approved as corrected and printed. Treasurer's report: Current balance \$2550.57. Geri Moore moved that we accept report, and JoBeth Maas seconded. Motion passed.

**Membership:** John Savage pointed out that there is a discrepancy about our membership numbers as provided by State MPA. John and Eric Moore will be rectifying our membership lists.

**Scholarship:** Don Baker reported that Jesse, our student pilot, will be back in town and will start with his flying lessons.

**WINGS:** South Central won both categories in the competition this year. Bolivar was a very close second. Fifty-two percent of West Plains Chapter members earned wings this year. Congratulations! Dean Jeffries called Camdenton to let them know about our Wings training sessions. FAST program is the safety team that will be a little more critical on how pilots are policed. There is still an emphasis on training at the local level, and on-line seminars are available.

**State Convention:** Jonathan Rimington reported that the State convention was very informative with excellent programs providing information on membership development. Bolivar is doing much better with new and retained members. Next year the state convention will be at St. Joseph.

**Program:** Roni Burns is working on next month's program.

**Public Relations:** Duane Smith shared information about the four levels of airports and how Bolivar fits into these levels: Commercial (major type)- Community (smallest).

**Activities:** Dean Jeffries reported that he, Roni Burns, Wendell Jones, and George flew to Bartlesville to see the 30-40 bi-wings flying in the event.

**Flight Ops:** Peter Hauer (you can get there from here) reported:

June 24 Turkey Mountain begins its activities. Free Breakfasts and lots of stuff. Check the brochure at our airport.

July 1: Sign up for the fly over to Osceola. Preflight is at 5:45 at M17. There will be a huge fireworks display .

July 2: Freedom Feast Celebration at El Dorado. Preflight is at 5:45 at M17. The Church of God of Holiness develops a big party for the city from 5-10 pm.

Jack Reynolds once again did a terrific job making sure the pilots were safe. John Savage mentioned that we now have some VHS series of videos about oil, tail plane icing, AOPA Flying in L.A. and Long Beach, The Wonderful World of Flying (by ABC). Other publications will be placed in the Pilot's Lounge.

**OSH KOSH:** Jack Reynolds says that he already has 5 planes that are going to leave M 17 on July 23, land in Quincy for lunch, and then to Watertown, Wisconsin. The plan is to then fly in on Monday morning to Osh Kosh. The airport is closed from about 1-5 each day, otherwise you can fly in and out. Eric Moore moved that we adjourn the meeting. Passed.

Jack Reynolds presented a video called One Six Right; this video was awesome. The video was about the Van Nuys Airport, now the busiest GA airport in the world. The video showed what changes the airport and aviation have made since the inception of the airport. One interesting fact of the video is that every 45 seconds a plan lands or takes off. Now that's busy! This was well done, and extremely interesting.
