EHS ALUMS ACTIVE IN SAVING ALMA MATER

In a press conference held on Monday, July 12, 2010, Dr. Eugene T.W. Sanders, CEO of the Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD) announced that despite the original verbiage in the CMSD Transformation Plan, our Alma Mater is scheduled to re-open in the fall of 2011. Two high schools (East and South High) were originally scheduled to close, based on various indicators noted in the Plan. Several meetings were held by community, political and religious advocates who all had one thing in common: they wanted to keep East open. Relentless in their efforts, something was said to foster a meeting at the Board of Education with Dr. Sanders. He met with a small group that would represent the larger groups. He listened with an open mind. Dr. Sanders stated this meeting afforded he and his team the opportunity to hear new information, and more meetings followed.

After careful consideration and more than one option being discussed, it was decided that East High School would not be demolished, and would re-open in the 2011-2012 school year. Dr. Sanders states the decision comes after many concerns heard through community forums, meetings & dialogue with community representatives.

EHS Alums active in these efforts were Robert Canady (Association President), Bishop John Hilton, Pastor Rufus Webb, Joe Kennedy, Barzella Canady (EHSAA Scholarship Chairwoman), Mittie Jordan, and Rhonda Young-Hurt (EHSAA Executive Board Chairwoman).

A "BLUE RIBBON" FOR BLUE BOMBER ALUMNI

As a result of their fervent efforts to save our Alma Mater subsequent to the announcement of the District's Transformation Plan, several alumni and members of the EHS Alumni Association Board of Directors have been selected by Dr. Eugene Sanders to participate on a committee whose formation derives from continuous dialogue with community representatives consisting of clergy, alumni and Ward 7 Councilman T. J. Dow.

A consensus was reached to establish a committee for the purpose of researching innovative models that would take advantage of the current East High location and community resources & propose options for East High School. The committee is titled the **East High School Blue Ribbon Committee**, and EHSAA President, Robert Canady will co-chair the committee, along with the CMSD's Christine Fowler-Mack. Renee Cavor, the CMSD's Transformation Plan Administrator as well as our own Executive Chairwoman, Rhonda Young-Hurt, will sit on the committee. Other EHS Alumni selected to participate are Bishop Hilton of Tabernacle of Faith Church, Pastor Rufus Webb of New Directions Church of God in Christ and Joe Kennedy, who works alongside Councilman Dow.

The CMSD and the Blue Ribbon Committee extend gratitude to The Cleveland Foundation for stepping in and partnering financially on this venture, as national travel is expected to be required.

HE SURVIVED A DEATH MARCH

Richard Francies (top middle photo) an Army technical sergeant who was installing radio stations in Bataan when the Japanese invaded, is one of an estimated 200 survivors of the Bataan Death March who are still alive to tell about their experiences. Approximately 12,000 American Soldiers became POWs and walked the Death March.

Richard Francies is a 1935 graduate of East High School. By the time he graduated, he was repairing radios and it had become one of his favorite things to do. When placed in front of a Japanese firing squad, it was this very skill that saved his life. Every August 29th, he celebrates the day a Japanese firing squad failed to kill him. Mr. Francies was a POW for 3½ years.

He walked the Bataan Death March...and survived. He survived the horrible conditions at a POW camp, overseas transport to Japan on a so-called Hell Ship and slave labor at a Mitsubishi copper mine – *only to face a firing squad.* After living 1225 days on a starvation diet consisting mostly of rice, Mr. Francies suffered from malaria, beriberi, two ruptured appendixes and more.

Joining the Army in 1937 (after attending The Ohio State University for one year), Francies was transferred to the Philippines in 1939 and was in the Signal Corps as a radio operator and later in radio maintenance. In December, 1941 he was slated to go home after his tour of duty, but stayed when the war began. He installed radio stations in Bataan, and was there when the Japanese invaded. Francies was among those on the Bataan Death March. While a POW, he became part of a crew that repaired radio and telephones in Manila where crew members sabotaged as much equipment as they repaired. Later he and other prisoners of war were shipped to Japan, where they were sent to Hanawa in Honshu to work in the copper mines of northern Japan from 1944 to 1945. While marching, the soldiers were told they would get food in the next town. For 11 days and over 60 miles, that never happened. The soldiers began disassembling their weapons and pitching them into the woods. At one point, Francies was so ill he hid out in the jungle, only to be found by a Filipino villager, who notified a Japanese soldier. This soldier gave Francies a shot of medicine that re-energized him. He wondered "How was I lucky enough to live and find a kind Japanese soldier?"

In 1945, his dream came true. He and the other soldiers were notified that the war was over. He and the other POWs painted a message: "Hanawa 550 POW's" on the barracks roof. He had done it. He survived the atrocities at the hands of the Japanese soldiers, as well as many medical issues that derived from being held captive.

Francies recalled the figure that, "In the Philippine theater, fifty-seven out of every hundred POW's died in captivity." After the war, Francies worked for 35 years for Ohio Bell. He tells his wartime story often at schools, churches, and civic organizations.

EHS ALUMNA ESTABLISHES ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP HONORING TWO FORMER EHS FACULTY

Thinking back to the 1980s and her years as an East High student in Cleveland, Ohio, Jacquelyn Meshelemiah (nee Cotton) doesn't immediately reflect on dances, boyfriends, or Friday night football games. Instead, her memories turn to a special chemistry teacher and his wife who taught home economics. Together, Kenneth and Lynette Hoehn opened their home, wallets, and hearts to students in need.

Jacquelyn credits Kenneth, who was also the school's director of athletics, with making chemistry fun and recalls how patient and encouraging he was with struggling students.

"I don't know how they provided help for so many students to play sports and participate in programs at East High, but they managed," said Jacquelyn, now an associate professor with the College of Social Work at The Ohio State University, where she earned three degrees. "Not only did they buy us little things, but they took us on trips and to visit colleges."

In her heart, Jacquelyn knew she would find a way to honor the Hoehns one day. That day arrived recently when she established the Kenneth E. and Lynette O. Hoehn Endowed Scholarship Fund to provide financial assistance to African Americans and other underrepresented groups studying social work at Ohio State.

Jacquelyn, her sister, and their children get together every year with the Hoehns, who are now retired, and talk with them frequently. She knows that many East High alumni consider the Hoehns to be extended family members and stay in touch. When the Hoehns heard about Jacquelyn's tribute to them, they cried. "I had called them and later they sent an e-mail and asked to pardon any typing errors because their vision was blurred with tears," she said.

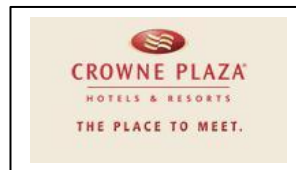

License About to be Suspended for it?

Drivers License Amnesty is once again being offered to assist obligors who are in arrears in their child support and have their license suspended for non payment. Due to the state of the economy and rising unemployment, obligors representing over 10,000 cases are being given an opportunity to get their license back so they can pursue employment and participate in job training in order pay their child support.

The program will run from **August 16, 2010 through September 24, 2010** and allow an obligor to pay a minimum of one month's child support and \$50.00 towards arrears to have his license reinstated.

Over 10,000 obligors will receive a letter and a follow up post card. CSEA also has a dedicated voicemail for the program.
