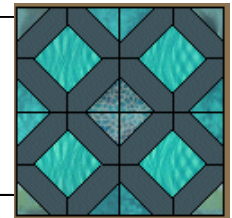

### Almond Joy Cake

1 chocolate cake mix WITH pudding  
Ingredients for cake mix—usually oil and eggs  
1 can evaporated milk  
2-1/2 cups sugar  
26 large marshmallows  
1 pkg (14 oz) coconut  
1/2 cup margarine  
1 pkg (12 oz) chocolate chips  
1 pkg (3-1/2 oz) slivered almonds

Prepare cake mix according to package directions and bake in a 9 x 13" pan. In saucepan, mix 1 cup of the evaporated milk, 1 cup sugar, marshmallows, and coconut. Heat until marshmallows are melted. Pour over hot cake. In saucepan, melt margarine and remaining milk and sugar and bring to a boil. Add chocolate chips and stir until melted. Stir in almonds and pour over cake. Cool before serving.

## So papilla Cheesecake

2 pkg crescent rolls (original)  
 2 pkg (8 oz) cream cheese (may use 1/3 less fat)  
 1-2/3 cup sugar  
 1stickbutter or oleo  
 Cinnamon to taste

Lay 1 can rolls on bottom of 9 x 13 pan. Mix 1 cup sugar with the 2 pkgs cream cheese. Spread mixture over rolls. Then lay 2nd can of rolls over mixture. Melt the butter and pour it over the top layer, then sprinkle remaining 2/3 cup sugar and cinnamon on top. Bake 350 degrees for 30 min. (Edges will be lightly brown.)

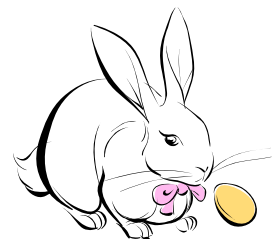
