Basil Tomato Tart

Read all directions before preparing

½ of a 15-ounce package folded refrigerated unbaked piecrust (use 1)
5 Roma tomatoes or 4 medium tomatoes
1 cup loosely packed fresh basil leaves
2-4 cloves of garlic
½ cup Kraft Mayonnaise
¼ cup grated Parmesan cheese
1/8 teaspoon ground white pepper

Unfold piecrust according to package directions. Place in a 9-inch quiche dish or glass pie plate. Flute edge; press with the tines of a fork, if desired. Line shell with double-thickness of foil. Bake in 450 degree F. oven for 8 minutes. Remove foil. Bake 4-5 minutes more or till set and dry. Remove from oven. Sprinkle crust with ½ cup of the mozzarella cheese. Cool on a wire rack for 2 hours.

Cut the tomatoes in wedges; drain on paper towels for 2 hours. Then arrange wedges atop cheese in pie shell.

In a food processor bowl, combine basil and garlic; cover and process till coarsely chopped. Sprinkle over tomatoes.

In a medium mixing bowl combine remaining mozzarella cheese, the mayonnaise, Parmesan cheese and pepper—combine dry ingredients first. Cover and chill for 2 hours. Spoon the cheese mixture over basil mixture, spreading evenly to cover the top.

Bake in a 375 degree F. oven for 35-40 minutes or till top is golden and bubbly. Watch the edges of the pie crust so they don't brown too quickly...add foil to edges if need be.
Serve warm.
