Pumpkin Squares

(Original Version)

**Crust:**

1 C flour
1/2 C oats
1/2 C brown sugar
1/2 C butter or oleo

Topping:

1/2 C nuts
1/2 C brown sugar
2 T butter or oleo

Filling:

2 C pumpkin
1 13-1/2 oz can Milnot or other canned milk
2 eggs
3/4 C sugar
1 tsp salt
1 tsp cinnamon

1/2 tsp ginger
1/4 tsp cloves

Mix crust ingredients until crumbly. Press into 13 x 9" pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 min. Combine filling ingredients and pour over crust in pan. Bake at 350 degree for 20 more min. Mix topping ingredients and spread over top. Return to oven for 15-20 more min.

Dorothy's Version

Use same ingredients for the crust and topping. FILLING: 2 C pumpkin pie filling
12 oz canned milk
2 eggs
3/4 C sugar
1 tsp pumpkin pie spice

Make crust, filling and topping same as original recipe. Bake the same times also, but I baked the last time until a knife came out clean when tested in the center of pan, about 30 to 35min versus the 20 min.

Thanksgiving

Presidents traditionally have granted the National Thanksgiving Turkey a “pardon”. For the past 15 years, the National Thanksgiving Turkeys and their alternates have been retired to Frying Pan Park in Fairfax County, Virginia.

The birds are commercial turkeys used in normal industry production, and they were raised using the same techniques as other commercial birds. They were fed a regular diet of corn and soybean meal and were provided a continuous supply of fresh-water. A few minor modifications were made to prepare the birds for the National Thanksgiving Turkey presentation. About 30 turkeys were removed from the normal commercial production flock and are being raised separately on the Trites farm. The birds are periodically hand fed and given additional interaction with people in an effort to acclimate them.

The role of the alternate turkey is not to be taken lightly. The rule book states that an alternate turkey is chosen in case the national Thanksgiving turkey cannot fulfill his role in the ceremony. It’s kind of like being the vice president.

Each year, thousands of people vote on the White House website to name the turkeys. In 2005, it was Marshmallow and Yam; in 2004 it was Biscuits and Gravy; and in 2003 it was Stars and Stripes.

T for time to be together, turkey, talk, and tangy weather.

H for harvest stored away, home, and hearth, and holiday.

A for autumn's frosty art, and abundance in the heart.

N for neighbors, and November, nice things, new things to remember.
