### Delicious Chicken Casserole

2 cups diced chicken (not fine)  
1 cup diced celery  
1 cup cooked rice  
1 can cream of chicken soup  
3/4 cup mayonnaise (Hellman's)  
1 teaspoon diced onion  
1 can sliced water chestnuts  
1 (3 oz. pkg.) slivered almonds  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
Dash of pepper  
1/2 to 1 teaspoon curry powder

Mix all ingredients together and put in a casserole dish. Cover with buttered bread crumbs. Bake at 350° for 40 minutes.
