Classic Baked Apples in a Crock Pot

2 tablespoons golden raisins
1/4 cup brown sugar
1 tsp lemon zest, grated
6 baking apples, cored

1 tsp cinnamon
2 tablespoons butter
1/4 cup orange juice
1/4 cup water

Mix the raisins, sugar, and lemon zest and fill the cored center of each apple. Put the apples in the crock pot. Sprinkle with cinnamon and dot with butter. Add the orange juice and water. Cover; cook on low 7 to 9 hours (or on high for 1-1/2 to 3-1/2 hours). Serve with a dollop of whipped cream.
