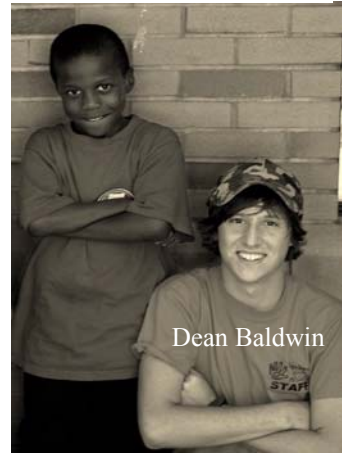

Dean Baldwin Joins CLM as the Center's First Associate

Dean was born and raised in rural Upstate New York just outside of Syracuse. From a young age he and his family attended a C&MA church in Oswego, NY. It was there that he was taught the scriptures about God's love for mankind, and his heart for the poor and hurting. Growing up Dean always had a desire to help hurting people and to do his part to fulfill Christ's Great Commission. As a teenager he had the opportunity to serve on two short term mission teams to Panama and Honduras. These trips helped confirm this desire to live with and to serve poor, marginalized people. In the summer of 2006 Dean worked with Aliquippa Impact's sum-

mer day camp program. This work instilled in him a desire to work with the poor and hurting in American cities.

After graduating from Toccoa Falls College in May 2008 with a BA in English, Dean plans to move into the city of Aliquippa. His goal is to work alongside existing Christian ministries to develop art-based community programs. As a child Dean was always interested in the arts. In high school Dean took as many art classes as he could, and even considered attending an art-institute for college. Unfortunately, growing up he was not aware of any Christian art-based ministries. To him he had to

make a choice to pursue art or to pursue missions/evangelism. Since college, he has become aware that this is a false dichotomy, and truly believes that the arts have powerful potential to reach people for Christ, instill hope, and create awareness.

Leadership Proposals Mailed

On Saturday, September 29th most of the CLM Leadership Proposals were mailed to a select group of family, friends, and CLM board members.
