## WHAT IS WINTER EVENT?

It is a day is designed to promote teamwork and Scout Spirit while providing Webelos with the outdoor Scouting experience. Webelos visit stations that are run by Boy Scouts, many of which require previous knowledge of knots and others teach new skills.

**LOCATION**      **Bicentennial Park (*west side*)** - East Allen Township

*Note: It's in the newer section of Bicentennial Park off of Colony Drive*

## WHAT ARE THE EVENTS?

### TEACHING STATIONS *(no preparation needed)*

Basic First Aid      Teams will learn Basic First Aid while earning Readyman requirements 3,4 and 5.  
Compass Course      Teams will learn how to use a compass and follow a basic compass course.  
Lashing      Teams will learn basic lashing skills.  
Map Reading      Teams will learn basic road map reading.

### SKILLED STATIONS *(prior knowledge is needed)*

Tent Pitching      Teams will hang a "tent" (tarp) between 2 trees with ropes. Prior knowledge of the following knots is required: TBD  
Toxic Waste      Teams are to move a can of "toxic waste" (water) from one point to another by using several long ropes.  
Scout Lore      Teams are given a written test on topics such as the Boy Scout Oath and Law and the Outdoor Code. All information is taken from the Webelos Handbook. Leaders are to offer NO assistance to boys. They may use their handbook if they want. Test results will be given to leaders at end of day.  
Ice Rescue      Teams are to rescue a "drowning victim" by tying several short pieces of rope together to make one long piece. Prior knowledge of the following knots is required: Bowline, Square Knot and Sheet Bend.

### OTHER STATIONS

Mystery Station      This one is a surprise!  
3-Man Snowshoe      Teams are to travel with "snowshoes" (2x6 boards) a specified distance.  
Klondike Sled      Teams will pull a Klondike Derby Sled a specified distance.  
Lunch - Teams are to cook their own lunch over a wood/charcoal fire. Fires and lunches are not scored.

## HOW TO PREPARE

Use den meetings practicing knots and reviewing the Webelos handbook.  
Plan a "Practice Day" to work on fire starting, tent pitching, ice rescue, snowshoe, etc.  
Have them practice no matter the weather since the Winter Event goes on rain, snow, shine, warm or cold.
