Sarah Jane wife of Marion Smock according to the 1900 North Belle Vernon, Rostraver Twp. Westmoreland Co., PA Census was 44 years old, married 27 years, mother of 14 children with 10 living in 1900 of which only 9 have been identified.

Smock born Oct 8, 1873 who may have died as an infant (the stone reflects an "infant" grave.) They later named a daughter "George" – most likely in honor of him. (Ed)

**Marion (Badger) Smock Obituary** (He died Sept. 20, 1913)

Marion Smock, one of our oldest and best known citizens, died on Saturday evening at 8 o'clock of cancer of the liver, in his 64th year. Mr. Smock has been ailing for the past two years and was unable to work for some months, yet was bedfast for only seven weeks preceding his demise.

Mr. Smock was a son of Abraham and Eliza Mackey Smock, and was born and lived in Belle Vernon all his life. He was for years a teamster and was perhaps better known by his nickname of "Badger," than otherwise. On March 6, 1873, he married Sarah Jane Culler, and to them were born 14 children, 10 of them living: Six daughters, Mrs. Lizzie Evans, Mrs. Irena Shunk, Mrs. Georgiana Dudgeon, Mrs. Hannah Ann Price, Mrs. Betty Evans, Mrs. Samantha Albright, and four sons, Jacob Issac, Glenn, Charles, and Frank. Mr. Smock leaves besides his widow and children, one sister, Mrs. James Kyle, Sr., and one brother, William Smock.

Mr. Smock was not a member of any church and never professed to be religious. He was kind hearted done his deeds, both good and bad, in the open. He believed we come into this world not of our own accord and we go out not of our own free will, but subject to the Supreme Power over all. He died as he lived, and as we remember him may we cover with a mantle of charity his earthly shortcomings, whatever they might have been, and think only of the good deeds.

The funeral services were held on Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, conducted by Rev. Perrin Baker, assisted by Rev. R.B. Mansell. Interment was made in the Belle Vernon cemetery. (He died Sept. 20, 1913).

Noah came to Kansas about 1884 or 1885, It is believed he stayed a while with his sister CeCelia and her husband Jeremiah B. Patterson in Oxford before his marriage. However, on his marriage application filed at Wellington, KS, He stated he was from Cowley Co. and he gave his age as 25 (he was actually 30 at the time), his bride to be was 18 years of age. They were married at the home of the bride's father, Joseph M. Spence 5 1/2 miles south of Oxford by Rev. James M. Via on March 21, 1886.

He married Mary June Spence of Oxford and first lived south near Slate Creek in a one-room log cabin. They had 5 children: Goldie, Sam, Orville, Lottie and Odessa. The three girls died before the age of four and are buried in the Yeager Cemetery 5 miles south and 1 and 1/2 miles East of Oxford.

Noah moved the family to western Kansas to farm, but after two years of crop failure they moved back. Orville remembered his father trading his shotgun for a team of mules so they could return. Noah and family moved to Newkirk Twp. Oklahoma Territory and are listed in the 1900 KS/OK Federal Census. They then moved to Arkansas City, KS, where Noah worked and started a delivery service and bought a house on north second street.

In 1901 Orville accompanied his father, by team and wagon, back to Pennsylvania, to his grandfather Samuels farm which came to be known as SMOCK, Pennsylvania.

Noah sold the house in Arkansas City and bought a small farm southeast of town on the Arkansas River near the mouth of the Walnut River where he could raise horses and coon hounds. He died in 1930 at home. Mary lived until 1942 and died at her sister Lottie Wartick's home in Oxford. Both Noah and Mary were buried in the Oxford Cemetery. Neither Noah or Mary are listed in the cemetery records, however, they did not have a head stone for many years and in 1968 Orville and his son Gene set a stone for them purchased from Day Monument Company in Arkansas City.

CeCelia married J. B. Patterson. Oxford Cemetery records have her listed as Cecelia Smock Patterson. Gene's older sisters remembered her as "Aunt Cel."

In the spring of 1944 His family was flooded out by the river, the house had mud and water damage as high as the tops of the windows, the barn and garage had big holes washed out from beneath them and all the chicken and hog houses washed down the river. Water was rising rapidly and starting to run around the driveway as He was driving the family to safety. He sold what was left of the farm and moved to town where he lived until the time of his death.

-----MEMORIES OF ORVILLE SMOCK-----

By: Robert Smock, his Nephew

Uncle Orville was an Army Veteran of World War I. He had many talents. He was an artist (Oil Paintings Mostly) ; he was a carver of wood and stone. He carved birds and fish and painted them true to life. He was also a taxidermist.

One funny story he told as a taxidermist was that he stuffed a snake, for a doctor in town. The snake was so big, it was as long as Uncle Orville's Barn. The doctor never did take it because he didn't have a place to put it. He also stuffed a possum on a stick mounted on a board for me. I had it a long time ( until the possum didn't have much fur left). He carved a string of fish one time and had them out on the front porch. They looked like a real string of fish hanging there, they were so true to life. He carved gun stocks that were really beautiful. He carved a buffalo out of solid walnut for one of his daughters using a nickel for a pattern. He also carved a tiger for one of the girls.

Uncle Orville had a Willy's Overland Car and one time my folks met him at the Railroad

Station, Missouri Pacific, I Think. I rode with Uncle Orville and as he pulled out onto Summit Street the door on my side flew open and I went out with it, clutching it with both of my arms over the door!

He had a couple of milk goats and a different car. At that time, all cars had metal around the top but the center of the car top was soft and one morning, they woke up and their two goats were making a noise - they had gone through the soft top roof of the car and were trapped - couldn't get out.

Aunt Bertha ( Uncle Orville's Wife ), raised Guinea's. They made good watch dogs; they cackled when anyone came around; they didn't have a dog; Aunt Bertha said her guinea's were good enough.

Their first son was close to my age. His name was Orville Wayne but he died when he was young.

In 1980, Gene ( Uncle Orville's Son ), took him to Alaska and they went fishing with someone else from Arkansas City, who met them there. When they got back home, it was extremely hot and Uncle Orville wasn't feeling very well. They took him to the VA Hospital in Wichita and that's when they discovered he had cancer.

Birds Flock in Home of Smocks

Sit in Orville Smock's living room for very long, and you almost expect to hear chirping. Two walls in Smock's house, 312 N. eighth St., carry peg board panels. Hanging on those panels is most of his collection of 111 carved and painted wooden birds. Each carving represents a different species. Each can be found in Kansas sometime during the year. Each was made by Smock. "I have always been interested in art," Smock, soon to be 85, said. "Painting, drawing ---- any kind of art has always interested me." Smock said he doesn't know when he first started painting. "That's too long ago to remember," He said. "I have always just done it. Art came first, even before the interest in birds." Smock has carved pieces from hummingbird to duck size. Each species is researched before he begins it, he said. "I wouldn't trust my memory on something like this," he said. "It would just fail you." Smock uses oil paint to color his wooden birds. He said he strives for accuracy, in his finished products, and know few people in town with more knowledge than himself. "Well, there may be a youngster now that knows more," he said, "but that's the only one I know about here." Teachers sometimes bring their students by Smock's home to show them his birds. "And we never turn them away," he said. "they ask questions no one but a child would ever think to ask. They want to know all about them." When Smock begins to carve a bird, he said, he draws a rough shape of it on a wood block. "I can work it down from there," he said. From that rough shape, Smock uses with a file, knife and sandpaper to smooth and give detail to his models. Many of the tools he uses he has made himself, his wife said. "they weren't in the stores when I first started," Smock said. "They weren't there in those days." Fine finishing work takes usually takes longer than the rough hewing of the wood. "But I like them both, he said. "I like both the fine work and the rough work, One has to go with the other." Smock describes himself as a self taught artist. A retired carpenter with a grade school education, the only art lessons he received were from a traveling art instructor, he said. "We had an art teacher who came around, so we might do a little water color or something," he said, "but all that did was create an interest in someone." A former farmer who used to stuff animals and once held a government permit to collect birds, their eggs and their nests, Smock said his interest in nature followed shortly after his first attempts to paint and draw. He has carved other animals and now shapes wire pictures of anything from tigers to deer, but he said his strongest interest is in birds. "I have always liked them and watched them," he said. "I have stuffed them. I like to read about them too." Smock stopped carving and painting about two years ago, when eye problems made it difficult for him to distinguish distance. "It didn't bother

the carving so much, but I couldn't paint," he said. " I'd make a blotch or I'd make two or three passes at it."  
" I stopped the carving because I couldn't do the painting," he said. "I couldn't find anyone else to paint  
them like I could, I guess I'm kind of fussy." Smock said his interest in wire shaping fills his time now  
the way wood carving and painting once did. But his fascination in birds and their habitat continues. He  
and his wife talk of owls they have seen in their trees and roadrunners they have spotted near here. "I have  
just always liked birds," Smock said, "I don't carve them any more, but I still have an interest in them."

lamps and she did the washing on an old Maytag gas powered washing machine. She went to town  
on Saturdays to do the family shopping. All that changed in the spring of 1944, when the Arkansas  
river flooded the family out on the farm. Moving to town was a whole new experience. Gas heat,  
electricity, running water, a real bathroom and even a telephone.

Bertha was a hard working mother, she did what she felt needed to be done. She clerked sales  
for a town auctioneer, and became a practical nurse, helping to take care of the elderly and new  
mothers. At one time she laughed and said that she had more kids running around Arkansas City  
than any other woman in town. Her grandmother, Lydia Turner, lived with the family for two years,  
later her father Bert stayed with the family until his death and her Uncle Earl and his wife Aunt  
Millie also came to live with her and her husband Orville, when they could no longer take care  
of themselves on their farm in Oklahoma.

**BURNED TO DEATH**

Bellevernon, Pa., Dec. 25. -- Leonard Smock was burned to death in his home near here last night as his wife listened to his agonized cries for help. Smock had been in town during the evening and was helped home by friends while under the influence of liquor. When in that condition he treated his family badly, and his wife and daughters stopped at a neighbor's instead of going home. Later, Mrs. Smock and her daughters upon going to the house found it to be in flames. Smock was heard calling to his wife for help, but the man could not be located. Being in the country, there was no way to fight the flames, and until the house was almost entirely destroyed nothing could be done.

It is believed that Smock tried to light a lamp and upset it. His wife is prostrated with grief and fears are entertained that she may lose her mind. Smock came of a good family and was aged 40 years. The family lost all their belongings and are left in destitute circumstances. [End]

It was a rabbit hunting accident that caused my father Robert<sup>11</sup> Smock to loose his right eye (circa 1927). As told to me by my dad, Edwin "Babe" Leeper (son of his cousin Edna (Smock – Kerr Smock's daughter) and Harvey Leeper) was in a position of the hunt lower on a slope than dad; when a rabbit broke and ran up the slope and toward dad. Dad said he hollered "don't shoot" but it was to late, the bb shot hit him in the face.

"Living with 200 baby chicks" (peeps) - I thought everyone did...

434 Bluff St, Belle Vernon, PA circa 1943 (I was about 8-9 years old - Ed Smock)

I remember it well... Times were tough, Dad was working at the Luster glass "box shop" in downtown Belle Vernon trying to make ends meet. He had the idea that to make money he would raise chickens and sale them and their eggs.

He ordered 200 baby chicks and a "brooder" through the Spiegel catalog (brooder was an electrically heated hood device that was to keep the chicks warm in the outside tool shed until they got big enough to keep themselves warm.). As luck would have it, the 200 baby chicks arrived without the brooder (and it was winter time)....

Our house only had three rooms; a kitchen and living room downstairs and a bedroom on the second floor (and of course, an outhouse). Dad decided to raise the 200 baby chicks in the living room until the brooder arrived. He built a small barrier between the living room, kitchen and the stairs going up to the bedroom. Mom put newspapers down all over the floor to try and catch the chicks "mess", water, and mash spills as much as possible. (bad smell...)

As you know, little baby chicks have a soft yellow fuzz on them that in time turns into feathers... I can tell you from experience, that these feathers allow small chickens to fly when they get to be around 7-8 weeks old..... Yes, the brooder never came and the chicks turned into "flyers" as well as "fryers". They were constantly on the fire place mantel, in the kitchen and when they finally figured out how to get to the upstairs bedroom my Mom said ""that's it""... These chickens must go...

Dad moved the chickens to the shed and put a kerosene lamp in with them for warmth. It was about four days later that Mom, brother Bob and I were awakened by calls of "Fire"... The shed was on fire.... The chickens had knocked over the kerosene lamp. Dad came running up the hill from the "box shop" to find all the chickens dead and his tools ruined.

A week later the brooder arrived from Spiegel - they wanted their money. Dad's note was very brief - and even at my young age, I knew it would not fit there.... Ed Smock

“””A long time ago my ancestors came to this country from the Netherlands. They settled in Penna. in a town called Smock. It is situated between Brownsville and Uniontown PA. They were coal miners and worked the mine till the coal ran out. The town is still there and on the map. The Smock Klan drifted all over the USA. They were a hard working class of people. Some of them are buried in Belle Vernon and some at Redstone where there is a small church where they went to services.

Those days if you wanted to travel on good roads you had to pay toll. Outside Brownsville going east the toll bldg. is still standing. I remember going with my Dad on a trip over this road. He hauled Moving with horses and wagon. Also my grandfather and my Dad did excavating. They started the town of Donora PA. They also paved the street going from BV. to N. BV with bricks. They were the 4th family to move to Belle Vernon. The name of Belle Vernon was to be Beautiful Green.

There was a coal mine connecting Belle Vernon and Pricedale. Mostly all the minors were pretty close to their work. The mills Pittsburgh Steel, wire mill, tin mill were about 3 to 5 miles from BV. in Monesson on the Monongahela river. There were plenty trains running hauling coal and misc from Pittsburgh to West Virginia. Also passenger trains. Today there are nothing. Every thing is rusting away. The part of B.V

called down town is dead. When I was a boy you could not hardly walk on the side walk for so many people. But today you hardly see anyone. Every body is moving West.

This is as far back as I can remember. I was born in 1904 and in July I'll be 90 so you see I can remember things. It would take a book to tell you all I can remember.

Memories (Marion Smock) (as written)

My mother Jennie Smock and I went out one autumn day to pick tomatoes over the hill from our place. I remember that when she threw the harness over the horse there was a snapping sound inside her. We got the sled fixed up to the horse and proceeded up the hill and picked those tomatoes. Coming down the hill the sled turned over and we had a devil of a time picking up all the tomatoes. Mom told me to take care of the horse, she wasn't feeling well.

She went into bed and I waited with the horse for Dad to get home. When he got home he took care of the horse and then he checked on Mother. He called her Mother, Grandma Nixon, in Todelo and told her Jennie was awful sick and she should come. He then took Mother to Lock #4 Hospital (in Charleroi). Her mother came and she talked with her for about a half an hour before she passed away. Father came home and told us Mother was gone. She died of blood poisoning I guess. It seems she busted something inside when she threw the harness and blood poisoning set in.

The children were farmed out to different people. Myself, Jake and Hazel (a baby) went to Toledo with Grandma Nixon, but there were too many for her to handle so Jake and I were sent to Father's Mother Sara (Sarah) Jane Smock at 616 Arch St. in Belle Vernon, PA. (Jennie had expressed that she did not want any of us kids to end up with Sara (Sarah) Jane before she died.) Jake was moved on to live with Aunt Grace Noels in Republic, PA. Aunt Grace was Uncle Glenn's wife, or should I say Uncle Glenn was her last husband. Uncle Glenn was my father's brother. My brother Robert was raised by my Dad's sister Aunt Dink (we never knew her by any other name). She lived in West Virginia. Dice was raised by John Philips in Bentlyville, PA. He was some relative but I don't know how.

Grandma Sara (Sarah) Jane was a small, frail woman but everyone was terrified of her. She chased people off her side walk and would make them go around it. I experienced many a whooping from the mean little old lady.

He (Dad) married in 1921 to Margaret "Tadpole" Forker. She went by Tad. She died in 1926.

Note provided by Edwin K. Smock 26 Mar 2005:

Jacob married second, Margaret ("Leahue" ?) Farquhar. (She went by "Tad" ) Marriage certificate by M.A. Riley (Alderman) 436 Diamond St. Pgh., Pa. reads: United in Marriage on 26 February 1921 at Pittsburgh PA. Margaret was born on 06 Dec 1901 and died 29 Mar 1926.

There were two families of Smocks, no relation. (This "no relation" comment has been proven to be not true, Jacob and Jennie's fathers were in fact cousins – Edwin K. Smock) On my Mothers side was Grandad Leonard Smock. He burned up in a fire Christmas Eve. Grandma Nixon was his wife. She married Mr. Nixon after Grandad burned. Her name was Carnes before marriage. Hixenball (Hixenbaugh) and John Irons was some relation. My mothers name was Jennie, she was a sister of Aunt Ethel and Aunt Hazel who died in Phoenix, AZ. Uncle Kerr Smock was a brother, Aunt Lillian and Aunt Ora Heldebrand was sisters. They scattered all over.

On my Dads side

My Granddad was Marion Smock. They called him Badger. Married my Grandmother Sarah Jane Culler. Brother of old Kerr Culler who died with his felt boots on. The rest I don't recall right now. My Grandma had 13 children, Glen, Jake, Frank, Pete, Hannah, Mance (Samantha), Betsy, Dink (Blanche), Elizabeth, Georgie, and three that died, I don't know their names.

(After you make the first left turn, an "old" looking stone with three graves in front of it. (2-3-4)

1. Samuel W. Shepler died July 24, 1877, in his 28, year
2. Evelina wife of Samuel Shepler (no dates-or did I miss it?) (older smaller stone)
3. Samuel Shepler 1814-1892
4. Elizabeth Coldren wife of Samuel Shepler 1827-1907
