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Note – we will be travelling to/from camp in Class A uniforms. Even though we are staying in a cabin, this trip is considered winter camping and you need to prepare accordingly. Coats, hats, gloves and winter boots, warm sleeping gear are all required. Shorts will not be permitted on this trip.

2012 Iron Chef Rules and Judging

Rules

1. Patrols need to create an appetizer, dinner, and dessert based on the secret ingredient: **COLA**
2. The entrees must be accompanied by a menu stating each dish and its ingredients.
3. All dishes need to be prepared on site, but some pre-work may be done. Examples are sauces, season mixes, and other additives may be created prior to the event. Scouts must prepare all parts of the meal. Any pre-work should be done by the scouts and scouts should be able to explain all their pre-work.
4. All members of the Patrol must contribute to the cooking process.
5. Timing of the event will be established the morning of the event. Dishes should be prepared on time to avoid penalty.
6. Patrols need to make one dish for judges and enough to feed their entire patrol.
7. Expenses: Patrols will be given \$25 from the Troop and may spend up to \$10 of their own money for additional items (receipts must accompany the menu). Spices and condiments do not count towards the cost of the event.
8. One six pack of Coca-Cola will be provided by the Troop to each cooking patrol. Any additional cans need to be provided at part of the patrol expenses.
9. Normal troop provided cooking utensils and stoves will be available. Patrols are allowed to bring their own pots, pans and utensils as desired. Scouts are encouraged to use camp-like equipment. (No EASY BAKE ovens!)
10. Patrols may provide any additional items for presentation purposes (special dishes, napkins, etc.)
11. Scoring and judging is done by the participating ASMs.
12. Patrols need to maintain a clean workspace throughout the competition.

Judging

1. Dishes will be judged on the following:
 - a. Presentation (10 points per course)
 - b. Taste and Texture (10 points per course)
 - c. Use of Secret Ingredient (5 points per course)
 - d. Preparation and Food Safety (20 points – entire process)
 - e. Teamwork and Communications (20 points – entire process)
2. Awards will be for top scores in:
 - a. Appetizer
 - b. Entrée
 - c. Dessert
 - d. Overall score
