Schedule Times for Station Leaders:

We will have staff available starting at 1 PM on Friday, 9 January to help with any station logistics. Please check in at the Program A/B Cabin to make sure there have not been any late changes to the logistics for the event. **Plan to have you station ready to go by 8 AM on Saturday, 10 January.** The first patrols could start arriving around 8:30 – we will keep the opening ceremony short.

We will provide each station with a packet of information that will include your score sheets (if you need them) when you check in.

Station Locations:

Sled inspection will be held in front of Program A/B Cabin. We are asking the patrols to “park” their sleds in the marked lanes in front of A/B before heading to the opening ceremony. The Opening Ceremony will be held in the parade field directly behind the Akelaland dining hall. Stations are throughout the Akelaland area and a map of the stations is provided in this document (Attachment 3). You are certainly welcome to use the site of your station as the campsite for your troop for the weekend.

Materials for Station Leaders:

We will provide Station Number signs and score sheets for your station. We are expecting that you will bring the other materials you need to run your station. If there is anything you need help with, please contact one of the event leads listed on the first page of this guide.

Procedures during the event:

As the patrol completes the event, record their score using the score sheet (sample provided as Attachment 1). This is the same score sheet we've used in past years and you should score the patrol based on their completion of your event (70 points) as well as team work (30 points). We ask that you use the criteria listed on this sheet to score the teamwork portion of the score. ***Please provide your scoring criteria to the event leads by 2 January so we can have score sheets printed for your station.***

Completed score sheets should be kept at the station and they will be picked up by event staff during the day.

IMPORTANT - When a patrol finishes the station please make sure you initial the Sled Record Sheet that each patrol will carry with them during the event. A sample of the Sled Record Sheet is provided for your reference (Attachment 2). Initial the sheet next to your station. This provides us with a double check so that we expect to collect a score sheet for each patrol that has the event signed off.

Instructions:

- 1) Start with the station highlighted in yellow
- 2) Proceed in order up to Station 10, then back to Station 1 and continue until you are finished. You must have the judge initial this sheet at each station.
- 3) If a station is backed up with sleds, go to the next station. You can return later to do the station that you skipped.
- 4) The Scout Knowledge Quiz is worth 20 bonus points. It must be turned in at the Program A-B Building with this sheet at the end of the day.
