The Exchange Club/Holland J. Stephens Center For the Prevention of Child Abuse

1988 – 2009 Twenty-One Years of Child Abuse Prevention in the Upper Cumberland

The Exchange Club/Holland J. Stephens Center, a non-profit, 501©3 family support and child abuse prevention center was started in 1988 by Anna Stephens, members of the First United Methodist Church in Livingston, and the Exchange Clubs of Livingston, Crossville and Lake Tansi through their desire to see effective services for children in an area with few other resources. The Center is licensed by the Tennessee Department of Children's Services and is a part of the National Exchange Club Foundation's network of child abuse prevention centers.

By identifying families at-risk of child abuse and neglect while the children are still young and by building on existing strengths within the family and community, we partner with parents and caregivers to provide safe and loving environments for their children. Therefore, the mission of The Exchange Club/Stephens Center is identify families at-risk of child abuse or neglect and to prevent the abuse or neglect through provision of the appropriate home-visiting program, group parenting class, advocacy, or community education program.

For the 2008 – 2009 year, the Stephens Center served a total of 98 parents and 127 children through in-home visitation and parenting class programs in Cumberland County. The Stephens Center provides services to Overton, Putnam, Cumberland, Jackson & White counties. They have served 549 parents and 568 children through in-home visitation and parenting class programs. Their new Overton County Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) program served 14 children in State's custody and trained 9 volunteers. In their Community Awareness program, they made 92 presentations to 7,108 adults and 2,291 children.

The Lake Tansi Exchange Club has been a supporter since 1988. In the past 12 years, we have donated a total of \$158,000 to The Exchange Club/Holland J. Stephens Center.
