



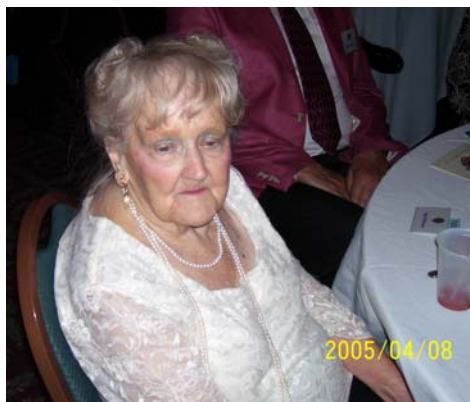

SECRETARY'S CORNER

AS PUBLISHED IN THE OCTOBER 24 BEACON

Brookville-Timberlake – The Club gave over 62 man hours on Sight services, 37 hours for Environment, 23 hours for Youth services, 567 hours on community services, 56 hours on International relations, and 404 hours for Health services. The club provided new eyeglasses and recycled 35 pair of used eyeglasses and \$815 for sight services. The club delivered baskets (SHARE) to deserving individuals in the community. They sorted food prior to pickup and delivery. The club still sews bears for hospitals. A program was presented by Lions Bill and Jackie Hadden on LAMP/RAM. The club sent 30 gift boxes for Military personnel. The club hosted the first Zone meeting for Lion Cheryl Johnson. The club collected \$2,112 in White Cane collections.
