## **History of our Flag Pole**

(Re-print from a 1976 news release found in the archives of Kenmore Community Club)

In a ceremony reminiscent of Flag Day festivities long past, the Kenmore Community Club, assisted by the Northshore Bicentennial Committee, dedicated a new 30 foot lighted flag pole on June 14.

Attended by 100 club members and area residents, the ceremonies were directed by LeRoy Anenson, chairman of the Northshore Bicentennial Committee, and Jean McBee, Community Club President.

The new flag was raised by the Color Guard of Boy Scout Troop 622 under Leader Dick Lamb. Taking part in the dedication program were Tami Whitaker, youth representative of the Bicentennial Committee; Peggy Glatt, Moreen Foley and Doug Weaver, who gave a salute to our Nation and the flag; and the invocation and benediction, given by Rev. Charles Franson.

Accompanied by Sylvia Gladstone on the flute, the audience joined in singing the Star Spangle Banner. The Kenmore Gunslingers Drill Team performed.

Contributing to make the placement of the flag pole a truly “community effort” were: Ruby Jessup, who submitted the original idea to the club; Arthur Michelson, who donated the flag; Leonard Hagen, who gave most of the material for the pole; Bill McBee, who put it together, and along with Russ Chamberlain and Jerry Davis, set it in place; the crew from Water District 79 who dug the hole; Kenmore Premix, who donated the sand and gravel for the concrete base; Harrold and Cleda Thompson, who made the commemorative plaque; the Kenmore Fire Department, who helped rescue the rope end when it became stuck on top the pole; and the Northeast Lake Washington Sewer District, who made speedy repairs to a broken line when the hole was being dug.

Following the out-door ceremony, club members and guests enjoyed a potluck supper at the hall.

And so it was on the day of June 14th, 1976 according to a news release found in the community club archives.
