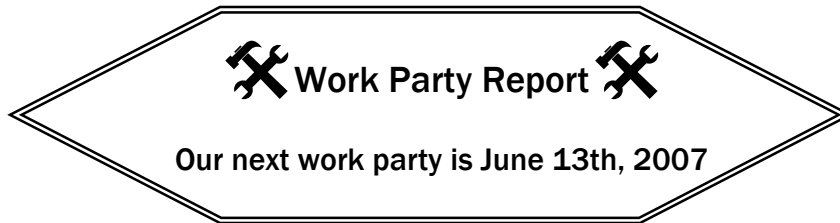

### RECIPE FOR MAY Cinco de Mayo is May 5<sup>th</sup>

#### CHICKEN CHALUPAS

4 to 5 single chicken breasts, precooked and diced

12 flour tortillas

1 pint sour cream

¾ lb sharp cheddar cheese, shredded

¾ lb Monterey cheese, shredded

Small can diced green chilies, drained

1 can sliced black olives

1/3 cup diced green onions w/tops

1 small onion, diced

2 cans Campbell's Cream of Chicken soup

Mix sour cream, cheese, chilies, olives, green onions, onion and soup. Set aside 1½ cups of this mix. To the remaining mixture, add the diced chicken. On each tortilla, place 2T chicken mixture and roll up.

Place in a 9x13 dish and one smaller dish (7 in one and 5 in the other.) Top with remaining 1½ cups of mix and sprinkle with more cheese and diced green onions. Refrigerate until ready to bake. Bake in 350 degree oven for 45 minutes. You can cut each tortilla in half to serve, if you wish.

## MOTHERS DAY

Sunday, May 13, 2007

In the United States, **Mother's Day** was copied from England by social activist Julia Ward Howe after the American Civil War with a call to unite women against war. She wrote the Mother's Day Proclamation. Today, some organizations are working to revive Howe's original vision of a holiday that celebrates peacemaking by mothers and others. The day now simply celebrates motherhood and thanking mothers. According to the National Restaurant Association, Mother's Day is now the most popular day of the year to dine out at a restaurant in the United States.

Mothering Sunday, commonly called "Mothers Day" in the United Kingdom, has no direct connection to the American practice. It falls on the fourth Sunday of Lent (exactly three weeks before Easter Sunday). It is believed to have originated from the 16th Century Christian practice of visiting one's mother church annually, which meant that most mothers would be reunited with their children on this day. Most historians believe that young apprentices and young women in servitude were released by their masters that weekend in order to visit their families. As a result of secularization, it is now principally used to celebrate and give thanks for mothers, although it is still recognized in the historical sense by some churches, with attention paid to Mary the mother of Jesus as well as the traditional concept 'mother church'.

## MEMORIAL DAY

Monday, May 28, 2007

**Memorial Day** is a United States federal holiday that is observed on the last Monday of May (observed in 2007 on May 28<sup>th</sup>.) It was formerly known as **Decoration Day**. This holiday commemorates U.S. men and women who have died in military service to their country. It began first to honor Union soldiers who died during the American Civil War. After World War I, it expanded to include those who died in any war or military action. One of the longest standing traditions is the running of the Indianapolis 500, which has been held in conjunction with Memorial Day since 1911.

Memorial Day formerly occurred on **May 30**, and some, such as the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) and Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW), advocate returning to this fixed date, although the significance of the date is tenuous. The VFW stated in a 2002 Memorial Day Address, "Changing the date merely to create three-day weekends has undermined the very meaning of the day. No doubt, this has contributed greatly to the general public's nonchalant observance of Memorial Day." Hawaii's Senator Daniel Inouye, a World War II veteran, has repeatedly introduced measures to return Memorial Day to its traditional day since 1998.

Memorial Day is currently observed by the US government as a holiday. Most financial institutions and US securities markets are also closed in observance.
