

Instructions for accessing the Songlearning MP3 Tracks™  
for the **2012 National Children's Choir**  
Conducted by Henry Leck

- Note that the 4 voice part links (URLs) below are listed from highest voice (s1) to lowest voice (a2), in order, **all in lower case**. If you receive a paper copy of this document, type the URL into your browser (**exactly** as you see it!) and click on Enter, then choose Save File when prompted. The zipped folder of Songlearning MP3 Tracks™ of your voice part will be downloaded to your download box. You will see the download progress bar move as the download occurs. Once it has finished downloading, double click on the file, and the Songlearning MP3 Tracks™ will load into your default download folder automatically. **Important:** If you try to play the files while they are still in the default download folder, they will not play, so be sure to drag the Songlearning MP3 Tracks™ from the download folder to a ***different folder and name it!***
- In the unlikely event that your computer does not have unzip capability built in, you can go to the following site and download a free program: [http://download.cnet.com/7-Zip/3000-2250\\_4-10045185.html](http://download.cnet.com/7-Zip/3000-2250_4-10045185.html)
- Open the Songlearning Systems™ Instructions and List of Tracks pdf, print it, and read through it carefully. Keep it handy for future reference. As well as listing the order of the songs/tracks, it contains some very helpful hints on how to learn your music quickly and accurately.
- In the unlikely event that your computer does not have Adobe Reader installed (to open pdf files), you can get the free application here: <http://get.adobe.com/reader/>
- **To learn your music:**  
Launch your music application (iTunes, Windows Media Player, etc.), then open the folder where you have stored your Songlearning MP3 Tracks™ and double click on the first track to play it, and then on each successive track. As you listen to your part being played in the foreground, you can drag the progress button left – during playing of the track – to repeat any difficult sections as many times as needed. This is a great way to practice! During this stage of learning your music, it is very important to be ***reading your music*** as you follow the Songlearning MP3 Tracks™! ***Doing so will make you a better musician!***
- You may also download the files onto an mp3 player (or burn your own CD) to practice anywhere you like, but remember to ***look*** at the music as well as listen! Please do not share or give the CD or Songlearning mp3 tracks to anyone outside your choir.
- If you have difficulty downloading the mp3 tracks, ask a sibling or friend to help you.

Type the URL for your voice part into your browser (**exactly** as you see it!) and press Enter.  
**URLs/Links are active now, and will go inactive on April 16, 2012, the day after your performance.**
